Westlake Hardware. We want to encourage CN residents to participate in this very rewarding and competitive event.




This is the biggest CNNA event of the year, so don't miss out on your chance to win the major award this year. Remember, you must be a CNNA member in order to be eligible for the judging.

Here are some important phone numbers that any OKC resident can use to report everything from barking dogs to pot holes. You might want to cut out this list and post it on your refrigerator for guick and easy reference.

Of all of the numbers listed, the most valuable one is the Action Center number. This is where you can call in any complaint or question you might have about city or neighborhood code enforcement. The Code Enforcement Division is responsible for keeping neighborhoods free of dilapidated buildings, tall grass and weeds and other neighborhood eyesores and nuisances.

Winter Safeguards

As the cold Oklahoma winter starts to set in be sure you have taken the proper precautions in keeping you home and family safe during the winter months. Here are some tips that might help.

- Make sure you have a smoke detector that is working.
- Check your chimney to be sure it is clear of anything that could catch fire.
- Unhook hoses from outdoor connections and cover the faucets to keep them from freezing.
- Keep space heaters away from anything that could burn. A space heater unsupervised can burn down your house.
- Dress warm when going out in the car.
 You never know when you might have car trouble.
- Leave water faucets inside the house dripping especially if they are on perimeter walls.
- Open the cabinet doors under sinks so warm air can get to them.
- Keep an eye on seniors living around you. On snowy days, check with them to see if your trip to the store can be helpful for them as well.
- Be sure your outdoor pets have a dry place to take cover from the snow and rain. Keep frozen water bowls broken daily.

Friendly Neighborhood Reminders

The CNNA would like to once again ask that boats, campers and other boating equipment kept on driveways is against the Covenants & Restrictions of CN. Please be thoughtful of this and find the proper place to keep these items.

Other reminders of importance are:

Corner lot parking is a concern in any neighborhood. Anything obstructing a person's view in the 25 foot site triangle, on a corner lot, is a violation of city code.

Property owners are required to keep their property in good maintenance. Examples, but not limited to: roof, paint, fencing.

Junk and debris is defined by the city as anything that is not designed for outdoor use, for a residential area. These items can not be stored outside.
