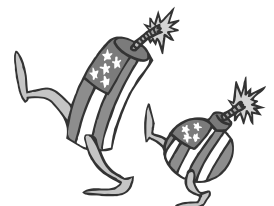

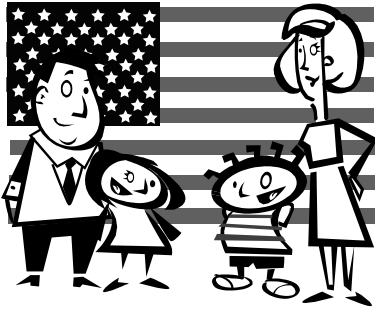

Tips on Flying the American Flag

When the flag of the United States is displayed from a staff projecting horizontally or at an angle from the window sill, balcony, or front of a building, the union of the flag should be placed at the peak of the staff unless the flag is at half-staff.



When flags of States, cities, or localities, or pennants of societies are flown on the same halyard with the flag of the United States, the latter should always be at the peak. No flag or pennant may be placed above the flag of the United States. Other flags flown with the U.S. flag may be the same size but not larger than the U.S. flag being flown.



When the flag is displayed in a manner other than by being flown from a staff, it should be displayed flat, whether indoors or out. When displayed either horizontally or vertically against a wall, the union should be uppermost and to the flag's own right, that is, to the observer's left. When displayed in a window it should be displayed in the same way, that is with the union or blue field to the left of the observer in the street.



When the flag is displayed on a car, the staff shall be fixed firmly to the chassis or window of the car, or clamped to the right fender.



Remember that the U.S. Flag is currently being flown at half-mast until July 5, due to the death of former President Ronald Reagan. The official rule states that the flag will be flown at half-mast for 30 days for the death of a sitting or former President.
