
Message from the President:

Since we are doing the additional tree removal on May 1, we decided to take advantage of the pole and chain saw we are renting.

We have noticed that there are many trees throughout CN that still have broken limbs in them from the ice storms we've had over the past several years. If you have

a broken limb you would like to have removed from your tree now is your chance to have that done and at a very reasonable rate. All you need to do is call Becky Rickard at 721-9457. It's a first come, first serve basis so don't hesitate to pick up the phone and call. We will only be able to do a limited amount of trimming.

Mending Fences

Almost every home in Canyon North has a fence. Most of them are growing old and are



in much need of repair. If this is the case for your fence, let the CNNA help. As a member, you have available to you a Home Depot discount coupon

that can help you save money on supplies if you choose to do the work yourself. If you need help finding a fence company to do the repairs we can make recommendations.

The city has codes that require property owners to keep their property in good maintenance. Examples, but not limited to: roof, paint and fence. If you are adding a fence or expanding what you currently have, you will need to call the city at 297-2525 to apply for a fence permit. Cost is \$20 and fines can be imposed. Be sure your fence contractor

has taken care of getting the permit if you are not doing the work yourself.

Take this time to not only mend fences literally but mend those fences that might have been broken with your neighbors if your fence is or has fallen down. What is behind your house is as important as what's in front. Fences affect your neighbor and when replacing them, talk to your neighbor and try to use the good neighbor rule of sharing the expense to do this.

Neighborly Reminders

As everyone should know, our neighborhood like all others has Restrictions & Covenants that help us keep our neighborhood looking the way it should when it was originally planned.



We would like to remind everyone of one of the most abused clauses in our R&C's. Our

Restrictions & Covenants no motor that homes, trailers, campers or boats, should be parked

or stored between the building line of your home and the front property line of your lot, or the side property line if you are on a corner lot. The intent of this covenant is to prohibit the



parking or storage of any or all vehicles or equipment other than conventional

passenger automobiles in operating condition.

Now that you are aware of this policy, we do not plan to disturb you if you have your boat or camper on the drive for an overnight clean up. Just be conscious that all of us know the policy and we do not want any neighbor to face penalties or fines from the city because they were unaware.

Remember, as a CNNA member we can provide you with discounts to self-storage units located on Hefner Road.
