Pet Preparedness

Recent storms brought to light the importance of not only being prepared for our own safety but for that of our pets as well.

Before something happens, plan ahead. Be sure your pet has proper identification - either

with a collar and tags, microchip or tattoo. Carry a current photo of you and your pet with you. It will help prove ownership if you face having to retrieve your pet from a shelter. Prepare a disaster supply kit for

each of your pets. Check this kit monthly to keep the supplies up to date. This should

include a pet carrier for each pet, food, water, leash, collar and emergency contact such as your vet's phone number, just to mention a few. Be sure you have a neighbor who knows you have



animals and knows where your disaster kit is kept.

During an emergency, evacuate your family and pets as early as possible. Take your disaster supply kit with you. Be aware of changing conditions. Monitor your TV or radio for information. This can save your own life as well as your pet's.

After the disaster, keep in mind that your pet's behavior may change. Keep them on a leash until you can safely release them. Pets require equal time to recover from the trauma and stress of an emergency as you do!

If you'd like further information on emergency preparedness for your pet, contact your veterinarian. Our thanks go to the Putnam North Animal Hospital who graciously provided this information.

Remember the importance of pets within our neighborhood. When walking your pet, please keep them on a leash. Your never know when a distraction will occur that can spell disaster for your pet and the safety of others around you.

Monthly Big Trash Pick-up . . .

Last month when we did our perimeter clean up on Rockwell, the question about how much big trash could be placed on the curb each month arose. With the city now starting to add additional costs to our utility bills for too much big trash left on the curb, we thought we'd list their guidelines, for clarification purposes.

Items should be set at least five feet from mailboxes, gas meters, cars, shrubs, or



meters, cars, shrubs, or anything else that could interfere with the mechanical lifting arms on the trucks. For the same reason, items should be set

at least ten feet away from utility poles, to prevent contact with overhead power lines.

The city will pick up as much as four cubic yards of Bulky Waste (about the size of two refrigerators) at no charge every month. If you put out more than four cubic yards, they will charge you \$6.95 for **every cubic yard** over the limit. On August 1, this rate will go up to \$7.16 per cubic yard over four feet.

With regard to regular weekly pickup, if you only have one Big Blue you *cannot* set additional trash bags out for pick up. You may only set out any additional bags if you have two Big Blues.

When Big Blue carts are overfilled, winds may cause them to tip over causing waste to blow out, thus littering the streets of our neighborhood. The city suggests bagging all items before placing them in the carts, making sure the cart lid closes, and to please not place carts in the street but on the curb instead.


