# Spring checklist for landscaping

- ☐ **Get Green:** Pre-emergent should be applied before the first signs of green to your lawns to assist in killing weeds. This should be done no later than mid-February to late March.
- ☐ **Mowing:** Early spring scalping will enhance the turfgrass during its transition. The stronger the turfgrass, the less weeds. Remember, a lower and more frequent mowing schedule in the spring will encourage the lawn to form a dense turf much more guickly.
- ☐ **Regular Leaf Pick-up:** A reminder that leaves can cause damage to plants and grass if not cleaned up.
- ☐ **Fertilization:** An application of fertilizer to the lawn as it breaks dormancy and starts to green up should be done in late March and early April.
- ☐ **Trees:** Deep root fertilization for trees provides nutrients to the trees as there are not enough nutrients in the soil as some trees will require.
- ☐ **Irrigation:** Provide the correct amount of supplemental watering to your lawn during the spring transition period. Do not allow the lawn to become too dry. Your lawn needs approximately one inch of supplemental irrigation per week.
