This is the first newsletter of the recently formed South-Mar Vista Neighborhood Association. The boundaries of our neighborhood are Venice Blvd., Washington Place, Sawtelle Ave., and Beethoven Blvd., see map on back page. We are a part of Mar Vista and benefit from the work of the Mar Vista Community Council but our own Association can influence things happening within our own neighborhood. The Association will provide several important roles essential in creating and maintaining a safe and attractive neighborhood. Included in these are liaison with the Mar Vista Community Council (MVCC) making sure that we are included in city improvements, street resurfacing and other efforts by the MVCC. Also important is working with LAPD to keep the neighborhood safe and help start Neighborhood Watch Programs. The South-Mar Neighborhood Association is an important step to uniting our community. Thanks to everyone that has been involved with getting the South-Mar Neighborhood Association off the ground. From the regular meeting attendees, to the folks that helped put this first news letter together. A Neighborhood Association is about neighbors working together to make the place they live, work and raise their families, a better place to do so. Regular attendees to our monthly meetings are the local LAPD Senior Lead Officers, Heidi and Pete Llanes. They inform us that major crime is down in our neighborhood; however lots of neighbors make it very easy for opportunist thieves to take property from cars, garages or homes. Hence the reason petty crime still exists. Neighborhood Watch groups are making it more difficult because they are organized and well informed by LAPD. If you do not have a Neighborhood Watch Group on your street or block, we can help you start one.

Mar Vista Community Council has allocated a lot of funds to the beautification of Venice Blvd.; this includes landscaping the median, tree trimming and decorative trash cans. Look for the development of the Blvd., please frequent the local business and spread the word. Also look for the Farmers Market coming soon on Sunday Mornings on Grand View Blvd. Safety and Security is a major concern if a major disaster strikes. We will probably be on our own for the first 3 days without help from any services. Are you prepared? Many Neighborhood Groups have there

own safety plans with generators, food, water and blankets in a storage facility at a rally point. We could organize a similar program for South-Mar; however we need your help. Membership Dues will help, your support at our monthly meetings will help and the support of neighbors to volunteer as Block Captains will help. Be the lead in your street, be a Block Captain! A successful Neighborhood Association is only as good as the neighbors involved and willing to support it. Please, support your Neighborhood Association! SoMar History

There is definitely interesting Mar Vista history in the area south of Venice Blvd. between Beethoven and Sawtelle, home of the South-Mar Neighborhood Association.

Venice Blvd. dates back to a rail line, which in 1902, connected central Los Angeles with the City of Ocean Park, incorporated in 1904. East Ocean Park Heights was one of the earliest housing tracts in what would become Mar Vista. This tract was between Centinela and Inglewood, south of Venice Blvd. to Washington Blvd. Originally the tract was divided into one acre lots which sold for \$1000 each in 1904. Lots one and two of this tract is where the Mar Vista Library is located today.

The site of the new fire station was the location of Brand's Restaurant in 1953. Marcasel was originally West Blvd. and renamed based on the nearby rail stop, Casa Del Mar. The change was requested by the Post Office because there was another West St. in Los Angeles.

In 1923, Washington Blvd. was widened to Lincoln. In this same year Culver City acquired a two mile strip along Washington, cutting Mar Vista in two. One reason cited was to include the Culver City Kennel Club in the city. This was the site of greyhound dog racing long before Costco.

Bruno Tesari leased a donut shop in 1956, which became the famous Bruno's Restaurant. The Tesari family did not want the building destroyed, so sold it to the Vineyard Fellowship for use as a church. Sam Johnson's Book Store at 12310 Venice Blvd. was the location of the Mar Vista Library in the 1950's. Prior to that the building was a bar.

The East-Marcasel one mile oval track has an interesting history that I have yet to fully uncover. I understand that 3966 Marcasel was a home owned by Fatty Arbuckle. Barnes City was directly south of Washington Blvd. Whether the Al Barnes Circus was set up inside the oval needs to be confirmed. 



12310 Venice Blvd.

In 1950, Mar Vista Library was upgraded from a sub-branch to a full branch. During the 1950's the library was located in this leased building at 12310 Venice Blvd. Prior to being a library, the building was a bar. One Call to City Hall

3-1-1 is a toll free citywide number for information and nonemergency services. Calls are answered 24 hours a day in English and Spanish. The operators take the information and pass it on to the proper department. The problem is usually fixed within a day or two. Call for the following kinds of problems: To remove trash on the streets or alleyways; To repair Street or traffic lights; To replace missing street signs; To have graffiti removed; To have potholes fixed. Spread the word about 3-1-1, the City Wide Service Directory.

Block Captains Needed

It is important to have active members on each street in the form of a Block Captain for safety, security and emergency preparedness. Block Captains also help disseminate information from the neighborhood association and the community council. Block Captains are still needed for most blocks in the neighborhood.
