

If you've got junk collecting in your garage or basement that you'd like to get rid of, mark your calendar for THIS Saturday, August 26th! In just a few days you will be able to dispose of trash, yard waste and even small appliances*. Here are the particulars on this event:

• seven westside neighborhoods will be participating (expect long lines at times)

• City staff will require proof of residency with either a photo ID or a current utility bill.

• No commercial haulers allowed. Commercial haulers must use the Metro Park Landfill.

• Scrub Items Allowed:

TRASH DUMPSTERS: General Trash including furniture

> Lawn mowers without fluids Televisions, Computers

YARD WASTE DUMPSTERS: Brush, Tree Limbs (3" Diameter or less; 6' long or less)

Loose leaves / grass clippings / straw / hay

APPLIANCES: (*Disposal fee of \$10.00 cash)

Air Conditioners, Refrigerators, Freezers, Microwaves, Dehumidifiers, Furnaces, Stoves, Washers, Dryers, Dishwashers, Water Heaters

ITEMS **NOT** ALLOWED: Car Batteries, Propane Tanks, Toxic Liquids

such as oil, paint or hazardous chemicals

UNLOADING PROCEDURE: Wait turn in line and ask where to unload

Plan to unload your vehicle within 15 minutes

Place all items in appropriate dumpsters

Clean up your own debris from unloading

VEHICLE SIZES ALLOWED: Pickup Truck (maximum 4' sideboards

Car or Small Trailer

Please Note: Assistance is provided for the elderly or disabled.

Monument Update

The IPNA monument, erected on the Woodland/Harwood island, is quickly approaching its one year anniversary. We're happy to report that the structure made it through a snowy winter, a repair of the planter base and the threat of grafitti artists who defaced other sign monuments near our area.

The monument, the Eagle Scout project of Ben Brown, is now a focal point for the neighborhood. It's been the gathering site for an IPNA quarterly meeting and our photograph for the Des Moines Register's recent feature on neighborhood organizations. It has also become a play place for area kids. While the island 'parks' do invite gatherings we would like to caution everyone to instruct children NOT TO CLIMB on the the monument planter. The base, which has been repaired once already, is delicate and cannot withstand the body weight of even small children. We appreciate everyone's consideration and attention.

The beautiful tulips, planted by last fall by the Simmons and DeForest-Colvig families, colorfully greeted drivers and passersby as they entered the neighborhood this spring. A beautiful summer petunia display now graces the planter. We would like to thank those involved with the planting and upkeep of these flowers from season to season. We think we saw the green thumb of Kurt Simmons in action most recently—Mark Kane was in charge last summer.

There was a discussion at the last quarterly meeting about installing a plaque of some kind on the north end of the monument. Instead of lettering across the front brick, which might be distracting or difficult to read, the plaque would convey information about the neighborhood and the date the monument was built. Des Moines Marathon to Run through Gil-Mar Park

On Sunday, October 15th the 2006 IMT Des Moines Marathon race will cover 26 miles of the city. Mile 7 includes a tour of Gil-Mar Park. Runners will enter our neighborhood from Polk Boulevard and will travel south on 44th Street. They will then cut east on Woodland, turn north on Harwood, continuing on along Bradway Place and Pleasant and then exiting onto Polk via Harwood -- completing the big Gil-Mar Park loop. - Just a reminder that the Des Moines public schools resume classes on Thursday, August 24th. Students will be walking to and from school, so please drive carefully.



A new group called Restoration Ingersoll is currently working on coordinating a

streetscape improvement plan and has been actively raising money for a pilot project for improvements on Ingersoll Avenue between 28th and 31st streets. If the pilot project is successful, improvements will be implemented along the remainder of the Ingersoll corridor.

The Chicago landscape firm of Douglas Hoerr was hired to create the design. The first plan would have an 8 ft. wide sidewalk on the north side of Ingersoll and a 6 ft. wide sidewalk on the south side. Pedestrian crossing areas would be enhanced, and street trees would be planted. This plan would cost \$650,000 with money coming from both city money and a federal grant. The second plan builds upon the first and would add bike racks, benches, trash receptacles and decorative urns similar to those in the downtown area. Curbing would be replaced and street lighting would be added. This second plan will cost \$2.3 million and would require additional outside sources of money.

In an effort to bridge the gap between available money and the second plan's cost, Restoration Ingersoll is selling inscribed bricks at a cost of \$100 each. The bricks are large enough for 2 lines of text at 13 characters per line. Each inscribed brick will be worked into the landscape design where bricks are called for. Restoration Ingersoll is also looking for additional sponsorships for larger items like benches and bike racks. If you'd like to be a sponsor, please contact:

The Bradford Pear tree is a flowering, non-fruiting, grafted hybrid that makes a very nice tree to plant along the driveway or street where space is limited. The Bradford Flowering Pear produces white flowers in the early spring and its leaves turn yellow in the fall. They hold a narrow shape, so they can be planted as close as six feet apart. Besides the masses of spring flowers and narrow shape, Bradford Pears are hardy and disease resistant. Their roots are not invasive like some trees, and the mature height won't interfere with overhead power lines.
