ark your calendar to attend this months Mayor's Community Conversation which will be held on Sept.18th at the Iroquois High school gym at 4515 Taylor Blvd.

The Mayor's Community Conversations begin promptly at 6:30 p.m. and offer citizens an opportunity to take questions and issues directly to Louisville Metro government departments and community agencies.

The Community Conversations follow this format:

The Mayor opens the meeting by introducing Louisville Metro department directors and describing their area of responsibility - think of it as Civics 101 about how our community is run.

Residents move around the room and speak directly - one-on-one - to department directors.

If they want to speak to the Mayor, they form a line in the middle aisle.

City staff members in blue shirts are on hand to direct residents to the proper agency or department.

Attendees can also register an idea or concern with MetroCall 311, the city's problem-solving telephone line. MetroCall staff log concerns in their computer and forward them to the appropriate department for follow up.

Light refreshments are served and there is an "information table" with brochures on local programs.




