### Third Ward Property Inspections

Please note that the city of Minneapolis began housing inspections in North and Northeast Minneapolis on May 15, 2006. Inspections will continue throughout the summer. Inspectors will look at residential buildings, garages, and sheds to make sure the properties are safe and well-maintained. They'll also look for nuisance type violations such as tall grass, inoperable vehicles, and rubbish in the yard. Please keep in mind that McKinley has a low interest revolving loan program to assist residents in making home improvements. #### The Sheila Wellstone Peace Garden

McKinley Community established a 24 plot community garden in the Spring of 2004 in partnership with Cityview School. Shortly thereafter, the garden was dedicated as the Sheila Wellstone Peace Garden to honor Sheila and raise the level of awareness with regards to community action and its impact on violence prevention – especially domestic violence. The garden is located on the grounds of Cityview School and shares a border with Perkins Hill Park. The overall goals of the park are to provide a dedicated space for outdoor classroom learning for science teachers and their students, create a location for community members to grow vegetables and flowers, and ensure a center of activity that will deter unwanted behavior in the park and around the school. The garden is now in its third year. This year, we are particularly focused on bringing out the entrepreneurial spirit of our children by teaching garden to farmer's market activities. We also encourage you to bring your family and join others by adopting plots to plant your own food and flowers over the summer months. ### Letter Writing Campaign - Absentee Landlords



We encourage you to keep your letters simple, to the point, and with specific details that need to be addressed. Although it might be difficult, please try and keep it respectful and courteous – include the date - and do not forget to courtesy copy McKinley Community so we can inform local city officials of our progress. We would also be interested in any responses that you receive. If you are concerned about an address and don't have access to the internet, please call the McKinley office or attend the Crime/Safety Meeting on the fourth Monday of every month at 6:30 p.m. at the Center for Families. We do have several respectful and concerned landlords in the neighborhood and we applaud their commitments to McKinley.


