ur August meeting had a great turnout, when over 75 members and guests came out to welcome John Swintosky and Milana Boz from Metro Parks, as they showed their progress with the Master Plans for improvements in Camp Taylor Memorial Park.

John and Milana presented two new designs, each with many new ideas for the park.

One of the chief ideas was how the parking lots are structured. The plans offered ideas about renovating and expanding the Taylor Avenue lot, near the pool, while also restructuring the lots on Lincoln Avenue.

Another main idea was where the walking paths are located. Both plans showed new paths that connect each feature of the park. One plan also showed a "walking loop", while the other simply had a scenic path.

Many changes were discussed, including:

- Installing a fence around the permitter of the park to prevent vehicles from entering the park.
- Moving the basketball court away from the playground area.
- Relocating the picnic shelters.
- Improving the grading and drainage.

Come out to the September 7th meeting, or complete the form in this edition of *Neighborhood News*, to place your vote to determine the order in which the park improvements should be performed.

Is there something we're missing? Maybe you have a different idea for the parking lots or a new idea for the pool? Talk with your Area Representative, so that your input can be included.
