DISPOSAL of TRASH, JUNK and DEBRIS


TULSA'S HOUSEHOLD POLLUTANT COLLECTION EVENT MARCH 25&26

It's from 10-3 in the Driller's Stadium Parking lot at the Fairgrounds. Use gate 7 off 15th St.. Bring Householder cleaners and toxins, yard-care products and pesticides, acids, caustics, thinners, household flammable liquids, fryer oil, batteries, bullets, (50 caliber and smaller) smoke alarms, oil, antifreeze, and oil-based, aerosol, and hobby paints.

Latex paints are not accepted at this event. Their recommendation for disposal of latex paints is to remove the lid, allow the paint to dry out completely then dispose of the can wrapped in newspaper in the regular trash.



It's Time for Rain (Hopefully!)
Our neighborhood storm drains are a vital asset to our neighborhood and must be treated with care so they will be able to keep the streets from flooding during the upcoming rains. These drains are for rainwater only and are not meant for disposal of any other liquids or solids. Leaves should not be pushed

in the drains and should be removed from gutters so they don't get carried in with the rain. If you

notice the storm drains on your street are brimming with leaves, please call *City of Tulsa Utilities* at



669-6100 to request they be cleaned out. This is different than street cleaners and the City will

come and clean out drains if enough calls are placed.

Allocation Of Your Homeowner Dues

Do you ever wonder what happens to your dues? The following is a report from the Board as to the spending forecast and allocation for 2006.

Where Does it All Go? The Board approved the following 2006 forecast.

\$ 68,000 pool operation and staffing

\$ 37,000 administrative cost (office, newsletter, utilities, legal, accounting, insurance, etc.)

622-6726

\$ 26,000 green area maint.

\$ 7,000 security patrol = \$138,000 Total operating cost Combined with forecasted dues of \$90,000 and pool operating income of \$30,000 =\$18,000 projected 2006 Shortfall (which will come from

savings).

This equates to the following allocation of every dollar of homeowner's dues, after pool income is applied directly to pool expenses.

36 cents - pool operation

34 cents - administration

24 cents - green area maint.

6 cents - security patrol

Here are a few things that we all can do to promote safety in the neighborhood:

- We can't be everywhere and see everything, we need your help. Be alert of your surroundings; know who lives on your block. Learn to observe and report suspicious activity around your home and your neighbor's home; not only to law enforcement or security but to your neighbors' as well.
- Decide that you're going to resist crime and not be a target, keep garage doors closed as much as possible. Upgrade locks and alarms. Put locks on gates that lead to back yards.
- · One of the most efficient and inexpensive security measures is <u>lighting</u>. Upgrade lighting around your property, especially in dark areas. Consider motion sensored lighting where convient, i.e. porches or front and side garage doors.
- · Develop a telephone tree system with neighbors to notify each other of suspicious activity.

We are available to you 24/7 for the reporting of suspicious activity or to answer a question that you may have. We are a patrol service, which means we are not constant in the neighborhood. We also provide an alarm response or home monitoring service for homeowners that maintain an alarm system and/or are away for an extended period of time. Again we look forward to the year of 2006 and working with those associated with the Longview Lake Association!
