Watching Our Neighborhood



GIT is looking for a few good volunteers to help launch our Neighborhood Watch and Citizens' Patrol Programs!

What is a Neighborhood Watch and why do we need it? The Neighborhood Watch Program is a collaborative effort between citizens and law enforcement; providing one of the oldest and most effective ways to prevent crime. Certainly the program is not designed to alter criminal behavior but it is designed to consistently reduce opportunities for crime to occur, create a greater

sense of security and address quality of life issues. Ultimately, Watch programs strengthen the economic and social fabric of communities.

How does it work? Imagine that cars were being vandalized just a few blocks away. You might not hear about this on the evening news, but if your neighbor called to share some details about the incidents, the information could prove valuable in keeping a lookout based on the suspect's description and by taking other preventative measures.

has generously agreed to coordinate this effort and serve as our Neighborhood Watch Captain. Now, all we need is one person per block to act as the Block Leader and liaison.





- Stairway with three or more steps without handrails
- Broken or missing siding
- Deteriorated overhangs
- Deteriorated or missing gutters or downspouts
- Cracks or holes in foundations
- Broken or missing windows
- Torn or missing screens

- Broken or missing storm or entry doors
- Deteriorated fencing
- Missing light fixtures
- Exposed electrical wiring
- Basement bedrooms without adequate windows
- Torn, deteriorated or missing basement screens
- Missing mortar broken back plaster on chimneys
- Hazardous electrical service entrance
- Unregistered/inoperable cars on street, yard, or alley
