Architectural Control Committee Submitted by Jim Baird

Spring is rapidly approaching, and with it the start of home maintenance season. Before you start any major project you might want to review the Windham Park Home Owners' Association rules and regulations to avoid any unnecessary delays or problems (see inside the Windham Park directory).

Some exterior projects on your property may require approval before you start, and will require the completion of the "Architectural Control Committee Request Form." The form is available from the neighborhood web site (www.windhampark.org) or either of the Architectural Control Committee members: Bob Zapulla or Jeff Welch. Some common projects that require the completion of the form are:

Exterior paint color change (an extensive palate of approved colors is available from the Committee - if you are repainting with the same colors then no approval is required)

Fences

Roofs (re-roofing projects are becoming frequent in the neighborhood, and it is important to note that only wood shakes or certain composite shingles are permitted)

Decks, screened-in porches or other structural additions

Swimming pools (above ground pools are not permitted)

Also, you should be aware the city of Overland Park closely regulates many home improvement or maintenance projects, many of which require building permits. Some might surprise you, such as water heater replacement, addition of a power outlet, and furnace replacement. For more information you should check the city of Overland Park's web site. 
