South Royal Palm Acres continues to have a relatively low crime rate along with a couple of other nearby neighborhoods. According to Lt. Hubrig of the BSO, it is because the people who commit crimes know where neighbors watch and know where they call.

The #1 deterrent to neighborhood crime is you, the watchful neighbor!

Lt. Hubrig also reported that there was one home burglary in Royal Palm Acres recently. In this case, a neighbor did notice suspicious activity, but hesitated in placing the call.

See a car you don't recognize or a person hanging around a home that gives you a funny feeling? You know better than a cop on patrol what is normal for your neighborhood.

If you suspect danger, a crime in action or want fast attention, call 911. If you have a funny feeling about something and just want a second pair of eyes to check it out, call BSO's non-emergency line at (954) 765-4321. If you can't get through, call the Oakland Park Station non-emergency number at (954) 561-6111.

In July, Oakland Park staff began devoting every Wednesday to allowing residents and contractors to walk in with complete applications and walk out with the following types of permits only:

Maximum of five (5) permits per day per customer



Plumbing

- · sewer replacements
- water service replacements
- plumbing fixture replacements
- water heater replacement
- gas appliance replacement (2)
- residential irrigation systems

Mechanical

- · air conditioner replacements
- pool heat pump replacements (2)

Electrical

- service changes
- low voltage permits [no fire alarms]
- burglar alarms

Structural

- re-roofs (4)
- fences (3) [vinyl coated (4)]
- concrete patios (3)
- shutters (4)
- window replacements (4)
- screen enclosures (3), (4)
- sheds (2), (3), (4)
- (2) Provide manufacturer's sheets and installation instructions.
- (3) Requires zoning review.
- (4) Product approvals required.

Oakland Park Strategic Planning Continues

I attended a Community Roundtable Meeting with about 30 other city residents and leaders. Together we identified and clarified the city's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats ("SWOT"). The purpose of our meeting was to set the framework and prepare the data and information to be used by our city commissioners when they meet in their Strategic Planning Workshop in the spring of 2007.

For those of you who missed the November neighborhood meeting, we had a discussion of the "SWOT" of our town. I brought the thoughts and comments of our neighborhood to the roundtable meeting and shared them with the City Manager and the group for inclusion in the strategic planning. This SWOT exercise is also posted on the City website for all residents to use to provide input to the commission.

All of this work will go towards providing our city leaders and employees with a "North Star" to guide the day-to-day actions of city staff and direction of our city's future growth and development.

The Performance Excellence Initiative will be a key contributor to minimize future cost increases through staff's efforts to regularly look for ways to improve the delivery of City services to residents and businesses. Through this work, the performance excellence initiative will strive to:

- a. Provide "Best in Broward" service delivery and results
- Establish our competitive advantage by becoming the employer of choice among cities in South Florida
- c. Build a climate that reinforces employee ownership of their jobs and day-to-day professionalism.

The initiative will be patterned after the Florida Sterling Council's Organizational Performance Excellence Program. Oakland Park will become one of a select group of Florida cities and counties that are undertaking a concerted effort to improve the services, programs and results that are important to residents and businesses.
