In our first year we learned numerous techniques to enhance our neighborhood by providing public forums and guest speakers that have made a difference in improving Camp Taylor.

Some of the smaller accomplishments include teaching neighbors how to use MetroCall 311 to fix potholes throughout the neighborhood and get trash picked up. MetroCall 311 users have found a lot of information on how Metro Government can solve problems in their areas.

In addition, Camp Zachary Taylor was selected to participate in the Lowe's Safe Neighborhoods Program. With the help of Metro Police and the Fire Department, over 1,000 of our homes were made safer, at no cost to the homeowners.

One of the projects we are working on with Metro Parks is to enhance Camp Taylor Memorial Park to further make it a neighborhood park. We made progress recently by successfully advocating to make Lee Street near the park a fire lane; making access to Durrett Lane and Lincoln Avenue better for the Fire Departments and the neighborhood.

Another of our current projects is working with Councilman Jim King to improve Belmar Drive near the railroad viaduct and painting the viaduct, along with landscaping the corridor entering Camp Taylor.

In the past year we've hosted speakers to discuss fire safety, police patrols, drainage issues, crimes against seniors, improvements to Camp Taylor Memorial Park, and many other issues that affect us all.

This year, our goal is to get more neighbors involved, because these issues are your issues. No matter what your talent or time constraints, there is a way you can help. Please help by volunteering your time and skills to make our community a better place to live!
