Reported Offenses for March 2007

Overall criminal offenses in Beechmont are at or below historic levels. The following reported totals occurred in March for your neighborhood:

- 8 Burglaries (which includes residential, business and garages/sheds)
- 10 Criminal Mischief/Vandalism
- 2 Auto Thefts
- 4 Thefts from Auto

There were no obvious patterns or trends to any specific offense. Overall, reported offenses have been lower than the neighborhood typically experiences this time of the year. Offense totals usually increase in warmer weather, and decrease during periods of sustained cold temperatures.

Tips and General Information

- Keep your car doors locked and windows up when your vehicle is unattended.
- Never leave valuables in plain-view inside your vehicle.
- Never leave your car running while unattended.
- Never leave garage doors open.....this is an open invitation to thieves.
- Never allow strangers inside your home or vehicle.
- Keep prescription medications out of sight of visitors to your home.

Remember to contact the TRU at 574-4661 to report less serious offenses by phone. They are available from 6AM to 10PM, Monday through Friday.

Bike Patrol

The 4th Division will be establishing a bike unit in the next several weeks. Bike Officers have shown to be an effective deterrent to criminal activity, and are well suited to addressing quality of life issues that present themselves in a neighborhood setting. Bike officers will be targeting thefts from auto's, vandalism, graffiti tagging, street crimes and auto thefts. If you see them in your neighborhood, feel free to discuss any specific concerns you have for your street.

Neighborhood Canvassing

Councilman Johnson has provided additional funding for increased crime prevention activities in district 21. Officers will be going door to door, handing out educational materials and discussing neighborhood concerns with the residents they encounter. We expect this initiative to begin in late Spring and we will conduct these canvasses periodically throughout the summer months.


