Greetings! I am sure most residents know Jim MacDonald, former mayor, moved out of Seneca Gardens last summer. What you might not know is whenever the mayor relocates their residence outside city limits an ordinance requires acting commissioners to appoint a fellow commissioner as interim mayor. I'm pleased to announce, I gladly accepted the position as of July 2005. The interim term will end November 2006.

My appointment left an open seat on the board of commissioners. Another city ordinance requires the remaining commissioners to seek and elect an interim commissioner. I am pleased to announce the election of Greg Singlust. Greg's interim term will also end November 2006.

For your information a commissioner's term is two years and the Mayor's is four. All positions will be a part of this November's ballot. Be sure to mark your calendars accordingly.

As interim mayor of Seneca Gardens I will continue the tradition of using the newsletter to pass on residents' comments and suggestions for improving our wonderful city. Parking

I've received several complaints regarding street parking. Hopefully all of our residents know Seneca Gardens has an ordinance that prohibits vehicles from being parked in the same place for longer than a 24 hour period. I would like to point out a few of the many reasons for having this ordinance. First, to provide safe exiting from driveways, second, provide ample to/ from passing lanes, and, of course, overall enhancement to our city's charm. Obviously it is more difficult to see oncoming traffic and to see small children if vehicles are parked on the street as opposed to driveways. Please be considerate. Park all vehicles in appropriate drivewavs.

Municipal Tax Collection

Currently one of the benefits of living in a sixth class city is the right to collect Municipal Taxes [5% of Premium] which are charged on all insurance policies [Auto, Homeowners, Renters, Valuable Items, Boat, and Umbrella].

Unfortunately, at this time, insurance companies are not required to send itemized statements with their tax payments. All cities, sixth class or otherwise, have

no way of determining whether they are receiving the full amount collected on behalf of their city. The problem is not whether the insurance companies are dispersing 100% of amount collected [State Audit Assure]. the problem is determining whether or not the City of Louisville is receiving part of Seneca Garden's tax revenues.

A rough estimate indicates we should be collecting somewhere around \$40,000. Last year we only received approximately \$20,000.

What can we do at this time? Call and write your current insurance agent(s) and insurance company(ies) and tell them to change both your mailing address and policy address to Seneca Gardens, KY 40205. In the past we suggested changing the policy address only. This approach helped: however, as mentioned we remain well short of our estimated revenue projections. If you continue to use the 40205 zip code you insurance mail will not be delayed or returned to the sender. Having Seneca Gardens listed in both the mailing and policy sections will help the insurance company tax processors recognize Seneca Gardens as the tax recipient.

The sooner we call and write our agents and insurance companies the sooner we will



start receiving our appropriate amount.

We are also looking for volunteers to re-organize Seneca Garden's *Block Watch* program. Please contact me if you are interested.


Sidewalk Project



Seneca Gardens' arborist, Michael Hayman, will give a 20 minute slide presentation about the Seneca Gardens Neighborhood Arboretum Sunday, 3:00pm on March 5, at Keneseth Israel Synagogue, 2531 Taylorsville Road. Seneca Gardens residents are invited to see this overview of our tree planting program which appears to be unique in the United States.

Former Seneca Gardens Mayor Jim MacDonald initiated this program after a storm destroyed 100 mature oaks and maples in 1987. About 1,000 diverse, arboretum-quality trees have been planted in visible sites since that storm.

Hayman will give an overview of the planting program, show photos of Seneca Gardens in bloom, and introduce you to the many national sources of trees which are planted in your community.

After the slide show, there will be an informal brain-

storming session with representatives of other neighborhoods who have started or want to start similar programs
