
Ain't She Sweet?


White Elephant Sale! Saturday, March 3, 2007





Board Report

COMMITTEES

The Board Committees are in operation and getting plans in place, and in some cases work is progressing, as in the installation of zone valves as a prelude to the replacement of water pipes throughout the community. This will take one or two years, and we hope to be able to fund it as we progress. It is necessary to install zone valves prior to the installation of the water lines, first, to reduce the amount of time the water is shut off when the lines are replaced, as with zone valves we can isolate one or two streets at a time. The time to install zone valves is much less than required to replace a complete waterline And second, in the future, when a water break or other maintenance is needed, we can again isolate the line to be worked on, thus inconveniencing as few residents as possible.

Committees are being led this year by some new directors. Finance is Crailey Gillies; Planning is Gail Jones; Architectural Review Committee (ARC) by Dick Nemi and Marketing is again led by Don Delzell. We have also created an ad hoc committee to review and revise the Rules and Regulations led by Ed Mosakowski.

NEW TREASURER

I am pleased to announce we have a new Treasurer- Crailey Gillies. He has taken over from Virginia Curtis. Welcome to the position Crailey. What can I say about Virginia? She has been a backbone of our community for many years, holding the position of President for many years and guiding us through our formative years. However, she made it clear that taking the position of Treasurer this year was only temporary until we could get another director as Treasurer. 

FLORIDA TAG REGISTRATION



WELLS



All the wells have been put on a timer so you will need to adjust your sprinkler timer accordingly. I have observed too many people watering all times of the day, for hours at a time. The timer is set for 5am-9am and 7:00 pm-11:00 pm. If you have your timer set for a different time your grass will not get watered. Please remember you are to water once a week on your scheduled day only. Here is the WATERING SCHEDULE:

Zone 1: Monday – Odd numbers (last number of your street address), Friday – Even numbers. (Mt. Oak, Piney Rd., Piney Ave. (East of the maintenance building), Mt. Key, Mt. Lancaster,



Mt. Madison, Mt. Newcastle, Mt. Pleasant and Mt. Curve). **Zone 2:** Tuesday - Odd numbers, Saturday - Even numbers. (Americana Ct., Mt. Isle, Mt. Piney Ave. (west of the maintenance shop), Americana Dr. north and south). **Zone 3:** Wednesday - Odd numbers, Sunday - Even numbers. (Mt. Arlington, Mt. Bristol, Mt. Deleon, Mt. Essex, Mt. Fairfield, Mt. Georgetown, Mt. Hawthorne, Mt. Jupiter, Mt. Quincy, Mt. Orange, Mt. Richmond, Mt. Saxon). No section is scheduled for Thursday. **Only water 20 min. per zone on your scheduled day.**

The City Water is shut off for plumbing repairs from 1-3:00 pm on the South side, third Wednesday of the month, 1-3:00 pm on the North side, fourth Wednesday of the month. I hope this helps anyone who was not sure what day and when to water.

About Saint Patrick

Saint Patrick is believed to have been born in the late fourth century, and is often confused with Palladius, a bishop who was sent by Pope Celestine in 431 to be the first bishop to the Irish believers in Christ. Saint Patrick was the patron saint and national apostle of Ireland who is credited with bringing Christianity to Ireland. Most of what is known about him comes from his two works, the Confessio, a spiritual autobiography, and his Epistola, a denunciation of British mistreatment of Irish Christians. Saint Patrick described himself as a "most humble-minded man, pouring forth a continuous paean of thanks to his Maker for having chosen him as the instrument whereby multitudes who had worshipped idols and unclean things had become the people of God." Saint Patrick is most known for driving the snakes from Ireland. It is true there are no snakes in Ireland, but there probably never have been - the island was separated from the rest of the continent at the end of the Ice Age. As in many old pagan religions, serpent symbols were common and often worshipped. Driving the snakes from Ireland was probably symbolic of putting an end to that pagan practice. While not the first to bring Christianity to Ireland, it is Patrick who is said to have encountered the Druids at Tara and abolished their pagan rites. The story holds that he converted the warrior chiefs and princes, baptizing them and thousands of their subjects in the "Holy Wells" that still bear this name.

There are several accounts of Saint Patrick's death. One says that Patrick died at Saul, Downpatrick, Ireland, on March 17, 460 A.D. His jawbone was preserved in a silver shrine and was often requested in times of childbirth, epileptic fits, and as a preservative against the "evil eye." Another account says that St. Patrick ended his days at Glastonbury, England and was buried there. The Chapel of St. Patrick still exists as part of Glastonbury Abbey. Today, many Catholic places of worship all around the world are named after St. Patrick, including cathedrals in New York and Dublin city.



E-Mail Lessons From a Computer Expert

<u>EDITOR'S NOTE</u>: This is the best advice I've ever seen and thought it warranted passing along to others. It contains some GREAT lessons on Emailing. I hope you find it helpful too! These suggestions come from a computer administration expert. Here are his basic **RULES TO LIVE BY**:

QUESTION: Do you really know how to forward emails? 50% of us do; 50% DO NOT.

Do you wonder why you get viruses or junk mail? Do you hate it? Every time you forward an email and there is information left over from the people who got the message before you, namely their email names and addresses you are contributing to your own problem. As the messages get forwarded along, the list of addresses builds, and builds, and builds, and all it takes is for some poor sap to get a virus, and their computer can send that virus to every email address that has come across their computer. Or, someone can take all of those addresses and sell them or send junk mail to them in the hopes that you will



go to some site and he will make five cents for each hit. That's right, all of that inconvenience over a nickel! How do you stop it? Well, there are several easy steps. **Try the following if you haven't done it before**:

- 1. <u>DELETE PREVIOUS ADDRESSES</u> When you forward an email, **DELETE** all of the other addresses that appear in the body of the message (at the top). That's right Delete them. Highlight them and delete them, backspace them, cut them, whatever it is you know how to do. It only takes a second. You MUST click the 'Forward' button first and then you will have full editing capabilities against the body and headers of the message. If you don't click on 'Forward' first, you won't be able to edit the message at all.
- 2. <u>USE THE BCC: OPTION FOR MULTIPLE TO: ADDRESSES</u> Whenever you send an email to more than one person do NOT use the TO: or CC: fields for adding email addresses. Always use the BCC: (Blind Carbon Copy) field for listing the email addresses. In this way, the people you send to will only see their own email address. If you don't see your BCC: option in your outgoing email message, click on where it says TO: and your address list will appear. Highlight the address and choose BCC: and that's it. It's that easy. When you send to BCC: your message will automatically say 'Undisclosed Recipients' in the 'TO:' field of the people who receive it.
- 3. <u>CLEAN UP THE SUBJECT LINE</u> Unless you really, really want to tell the recipient you had forwarded the message, **remove any 'FW' in the subject line**. You can re-name the subject if you wish or even fix spelling.
- 4. **DO NOT 'NEST' FORWARDED EMAILS** Ever get those emails that you have to open 10 messages in order to read the one page with the information on it? **ALWAYS hit your Forward button from the actual email you are reading.** By forwarding from the actual message you wish someone to view; you stop them from having to open many emails just to see what you sent. ... continued on page 40

Hair Dryer Precautions



Ithough safety statistics have improved dramatically, the Consumer Product Safety Commission notes that electrocutions and fires occur every year from the use of hair dryers. Here are some of the commission's safety tips to avoid injury or death when operating a hair dryer:



- Don't use a hair dryer while bathing, and keep it away from water and other liquids.
- Don't put a hair dryer where it can fall or be pulled into a tub or sink.
- Don't block the air openings of a hair dryer (for example, by laying it down on a soft bed or couch) while it's turned on. Keep the air openings free of lint, hair, and other matter to reduce the risk of fire.
 - Don't use a hair dryer outdoors.
- Don't use a hair dryer where aerosol or spray products are being used. Be sure to turn it off before applying hairspray.
- Don't use a hair dryer to dry water that's been splashed on your clothes. This can damage the fabric and could lead to a fire.
