

Weatherization Programs and LBNA Home Improvement Program are Options for Heating Help


At the January LBNA General membership meeting, Muriel Dickenson of the MN Weatherization and Energy efficiency programs highlighted the requirements and benefits of using this important program. Each county has this program and last year there were over 10,000 applicants. This program can help with everything from inspections of furnaces and homes for energy efficiency to replacement grants for weatherization of homes, and replacement of heating and cooling appliances. There are several application criteria based on household income for a three month period, fuel consumption, and energy provider. As an example a one person household income for a three month period can't exceed \$4,987 to qualify; a two person household income can't exceed \$6,522 for the three month period in order to qualify. There are several criteria and other possible assistance options so for further information contact Muriel Dickenson at 612-767-1746 or mdickenson@cmpls.org.

The Lind-Bohanon Neighborhood Association also has low interest home improvement loan program that could help with furnace or window replacement. And we also have an emergency assistance program for the home that needs immediate attention repairing or replacing furnaces. - How does the block club build connections between people?

- In what ways does the block club work with the Minneapolis Police Department?
- On a scale of 1 to 5, with 5 being highest, how would you rate this block club? Why?
- How has life on the block improved through the block club's efforts?

Be sure to include the name, address, phone number, and email address of the block club leader for the club you are nominating, as well as your own (the nominator's) name, address, phone number, and email address.

Information about Emailing

With the ease of information sharing, this forwarded email seemed a simple reminder worth sharing with neighbors to not lose sight of our responsibility.

"Shannon could hear the footsteps behind her as she walked toward home. The thought of being followed made her heart beat faster. She was afraid to look back and she was glad she was almost home. She saw the porch light burning and she leaned against the door for a moment, relieved to be in the safety of her home. She glanced out the window to see if anyone was there. The sidewalk was empty.

After tossing her books on the sofa, she decided to grab a snack and get on-line. She logged on under her screen name ByAngel213. She checked her Buddy List and saw GoTo123 was on. She sent him an instant message:

<u>ByAngel213</u>: Hi. I'm glad you are on! I thought someone was following me home today. It was really weird!

<u>GoTo123</u>: LOL you watch too much TV. Why would someone be following you? Don't you live in a safe neighborhood?

ByAngel213: Of course I do. LOL I guess it was my imagination cuz' I didn't see anybody when I looked out.

<u>GoTo123</u>: Unless you gave your name out on-line. You haven't done that have you?

ByAngel213: Of course not. I'm not stupid you know.

GoTo123: Did you have a softball game after school today?

ByAngel213: Yes and we won!!

GoTo123: That's great! Who did you play?

<u>ByAngel213</u>: We played the Hornets. LOL their uniforms are so gross! They look like bees. LOL

GoTo123: What is your team called?

<u>ByAngel213</u>: We are the Canton Cats. We have tiger paws on our uniforms. They are really cool.

GoTo123: Did you pitch?

<u>ByAngel213</u>: No I play second base. I got to go. My homework has to be done before my parents get home. I don't want them mad at me. Bye!

GoTo123: Catch you later. Bye

Meanwhile......GoTo123 went to the member menu and began to search for her profile. When it came up, he highlighted it and printed it out. He took out a pen and began to write down what he knew about Angel so far. Her name: Shannon, Birthday: Jan. 3, 1985, Age: 13, State where she lived: North Carolina, Hobbies: softball, chorus, skating and going to the mall. Besides this information, he knew she lived in Canton because she had just told him.

He knew she stayed by herself until 6:30 p.m. every afternoon until her parents came home from work. He knew she played softball on Thursday afternoons on the school team, and the team was named the Canton Cats. Her favorite number 7 was printed on her jersey. He knew she was in the eighth grade at the Canton Junior High

School. She had told him all this in the conversations they had on-line. He had enough information to find her now.

Shannon didn't tell her parents about the incident on the way home from the ball park that day. She didn't want them to make a scene and stop her from walking home from the softball games. Parents were always overreacting and hers were the worst. It made her wish she was not an only child. Maybe if she had brothers and sisters, her parents wouldn't be so overprotective.

By Thursday, Shannon had forgotten about the footsteps following her. Her game was in full swing when suddenly she felt someone staring at her. It was then that the memory came back. She glanced up from her second base position to see a man watching her closely. He was leaning against the fence behind first base and he smiled when she looked at him. He didn't look scary and she guickly dismissed the fear she had felt.

After the game, he sat on a bleacher while she talked to the coach. She noticed his smile once again as she walked past him. He nodded and she smiled back. He noticed her name on the back of her shirt. He knew he had found her. Quietly, he walked a safe distance behind her.

Kids are taught not to tell anyone when they are alone, yet they do it all the time on-line. The wrong people trick you into giving out information a little here and there online. Before you know it, you have told them enough for them to find you without even realizing you have done it."

I hope you've learned a lesson from this and won't do it again. Tell others about this so they will be safe too?" "It's a promise!"

NW Metro Transit Study holding Public Meetings

Metro Transit is reviewing and restructuring the bus routes in north Minneapolis and the northwest suburbs. This project, called the Northwest Metro Transit Study, will update the bus route network to match today's travel patterns and new destinations. Details about the changes proposed for the routes in north Minneapolis can be found in the Northwest Transit Study Concept Plan, available online at www.metrotransit.org

Northwest metro area stats reveal there are 45 bus routes, with 400,000 residents and 315,000 jobs. There are 10.3 million annual bus rides which is 12% of Metro Transit's ridership. The routes that would be affected by the Northwest Metro Transit Study: 5,7,14,19,22,29,32,715,716,717, 721,722, 723, 724, 755, 756, 758, 760, 761, 762, 764, 766, and 801.

The objectives of the study are to 1) Provide faster and more direct service to major destinations. 2) Improve reliability, travel speed and convenience of transit. 3) Better use of existing resources to meet residential and employment demand. 4) Improve connections between neighborhoods, routes and transit centers. 5) Integrate plans for new services and facilities, such as the Bottineau Boulevard Bus Rapid Transit project.

The timeline is to hold public meetings in May and June of 2006. Modify the plan based on public comments through the summer. Present the plan to the Metropolitan Council for final approval in September of this year and then begin service changes in 2007.

New Noise Ordinance Means Landlords can be Cited for Noisy or Unruly Events on Properties

A new noise ordinance passed by the Minneapolis City Council in February will add new tools to help keep neighborhoods clean and livable. On July 1, 2006, Minneapolis Police will begin enforcing the new ordinance, which means landlords and property owners may receive administrative citations for noisy or unruly activities occurring on their properties.

The City Council passed the ordinance in response to neighborhood complaints that police lacked an effective set of tools to manage the noise, litter, and unruly behavior that accompany many house parties and residential events. The new rules permit police to first warn and then fine landlords and property owners who refuse to take appropriate action to correct problems of noisy or unruly behavior in the residences they own or manage.

Beginning July 1, police will mail warning notices to property owners or landlords when they have good evidence that a "noisy or unruly assembly" has occurred on their residential property. "Noisy or unruly assemblies" are defined as gatherings of people between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. on residential properties whose noisy or otherwise illegal conduct would be likely to cause significant discomfort or annoyance to people of normal sensitivities.

The notices warn property owners and landlords that they could be fined if there is another noisy or unruly assembly at that address within the next 180 days. There is a 21-day grace period after the initial warning is mailed, which means landlords can't be fined for noisy activities during that time. This grace period gives property owners and landlords the chance to take steps to correct the problem before their properties become eligible for fines.

The first administrative fine issued for a property will be in the amount of \$200. Fines will continue to double with each additional

New Noise Ordinance Means Landlords can be Cited for Noisy or Unruly Events on Properties


A new noise ordinance passed by the Minneapolis City Council in February will add new tools to help keep neighborhoods clean and livable. On July 1, 2006, Minneapolis Police will begin enforcing the new ordinance, which means landlords and property owners may receive administrative citations for noisy or unruly activities occurring on their properties.

The City Council passed the ordinance in response to neighborhood complaints that police lacked an effective set of tools to manage the noise, litter, and unruly behavior that accompany many house parties and residential events. The new rules permit police to first warn and then fine landlords and property owners who refuse to take appropriate action to correct problems of noisy or unruly behavior in the residences they own or manage.

Beginning July 1, police will mail warning notices to property owners or landlords when they have good evidence that a "noisy or unruly assembly" has occurred on their residential property. "Noisy or unruly assemblies" are defined as gatherings of people between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. on residential properties whose noisy or otherwise illegal conduct would be likely to cause significant discomfort or annoyance to people of normal sensitivities.

The notices warn property owners and landlords that they could be fined if there is another noisy or unruly assembly at that address within the next 180 days. There is a 21-day grace period after the initial warning is mailed, which means landlords can't be fined for noisy activities during that time. This grace period gives property owners and landlords the chance to take steps to correct the problem before their properties become eligible for fines.

The first administrative fine issued for a property will be in the amount of \$200. Fines will continue to double with each additional incident over a 24-month period. Community members, landlords, or property owners who have questions about the new process should call the neighborhood crime prevention specialist Shannon McDonough 612-673-2805. Another Plus for Youth! Collaboration Creates Opportunities

The Youth Are Here! mapping project is a remarkable story of adolescents and adults working together for the common good. In a unique



collaborative, some young people are using their summer break to let others know *What's Up* that's good for kids these days. With training, supervision, and support from adults, they walk the streets in teams in several of North and South Minneapolis neighborhoods, including Camden. They talk with other young people, families, business owners, and community leaders; they ask about places and people that are friendly to children and youth; they learn what kinds of positive opportunities and programs are and are not available to help keep them out of both trouble and harm's way. And soon they will work with designers to create actual maps of these resources.

Four neighborhood organizations partnering in Camden, McKinley, Shingle Creek, Lind-Bohanon, and Cleveland, were developing a collaborative plan to better serve the over 16,000 young people in the Camden area. In the early planning stages they discovered the Youth Coordinating Board had done something very similar to the work they were planning and began to enlist their assistance and took on the challenge of developing a Youth are Here! Project for the Camden area.

According to youth development researcher Rebecca Saito of the University of Minnesota, this awareness raising Youth are Here! project is important because studies show that *less than half of all young people participate in out-of-school youth programs.*

Often barriers to participating include not knowing what's out there, not trusting that they are welcome, and not having nearly enough of these positive people and places in their lives. "If you believe, as most experts do, that all young people can benefit from captivating, high-quality opportunities and programs," says Saito, "then you cannot be happy with this trend." "The Youth are Here! Project has led to some tremendous results for us in the past and we're excited to be teaming up with the Camden partners because of the citywide exposure and opportunities this will provide for the youth in the city."

Saito and her husband, fellow youth development expert Delroy Calhoun, started the initiative in 2005 in their Whittier neighborhood. This year there are teams working in the Camden and Near North communities on the north side, and along the I-35W corridor in south Minneapolis. Each team has its own unique flair. In Camden, collaborating to lead the effort are Cleveland, Lind-Bohanon, Shingle Creek, and McKinley

neighborhood organizations, Hennepin County School Success Initiative, and the Jenny Lind and Lucy Craft Laney Community Education departments. Due to the size of Camden, there are two phenomenal adult crew leaders, Linnea Hackett and Ross Ayoka, supporting the effort. In South Minneapolis, longtime Parks and Recreation staff member Marshall Wylie is

basing his efforts out of Central Park, but also drawing on his many connections.

Once the maps are created, the groups—known as *Youth Action Crews*—will deliver them to teens and parents in neighborhoods that census data show have high concentrations of young people. According to 2000 Census data, there are 16,123 youth under the age of 24 living in Camden. Youthfriendly businesses and



organizations will receive large yellow "Youth Are Here!" signs they can post to let young people know they are welcome. Specific program and activity information will be available on the *What's Up* hotline, 612-399-9999.

"This is a different story about young people," says crew leader Ayoka. "It's an inspiring one...one that needs to be told."

Youth Are Here! is supported by the Minneapolis Youth Coordinating Board and the McKnight Foundation. Other partners include NorthWay Community Trust, Minneapolis Parks and Recreation, YO! The Movement, Wells Fargo, and the University of Minnesota.


