

Formed out of the **Block Watch** program, National Night Out is a chance for neighbors to come together to block out crime in their communities. The best defense against crime is to have well-connected, vigilant neighbors.



Meat, drinks and table items will be provided by our civic association. We ask that each family bring a covered dish of some nature: such as relish trays, main dishes, salads, chips & dip, desserts or fruit. Also, please **bring a chair** to sit on. This is a great opportunity for you to meet your neighbors and some of the new residents who have moved into our neighborhood.

As we enjoy a shared meal with neighbors, we would also like to share the same opportunity with other families. We are asking everyone who attends the National Night Out event to donate a can of food, soap, toilet tissue, dish detergent or any other household items that are used daily in the home. Sunny Days and Stormy Nights

It seems that Columbus has seen a bit more rain and heard a few more rumbles of thunder in the recent weeks than residents are used to, prompting us to provide you with information that will make your family as safe as possible.

Make sure your homeowners and/or renters insurance is up-to-date and has adequate coverage for your families needs, hopefully you'll never have to use it but it is far better to have the piece of mind that is it there when you need it. To further protect your home from water damage, be sure to clean out you gutters and make sure that drainage systems are clear of debris. It is also important to keep **sewer openings** free of grass clippings and leaves.



For the most up-to-date watches and warnings, every home should have a weather radio. The **National**



Weather Radio broadcast requires a special radio receiver that is available at most major retailers for as little as \$20. The National Weather Radio and the Emergency Alert System will provide your home with weather warnings, post-event information in the result of a national disaster, environmental or chemical situation and public safety announcements such as the Amber Alert System. The NWR does not endorse any particular brand or make of radio but offers these suggestions when shopping for your radio. The radio you purchase should have a battery backup, an external antenna jack and for conven-

ience, SAME technology. SAME or Specific Alert Message Encoding allows you the pinpoint the area you would like to receive alerts about thus eliminating most false alarms. Please make sure that your family is prepared in the event of any emer-

gency; keep important phone numbers posted clearly, arm your home with fire and carbon monoxide detectors and check your batteries often in them. Safety starts at home.




MMTACA Cleans Cooke Road Gateway

Suspicious Suspects

Just a reminder for residents to be very vigilant during the warmer weather; crime is always on the rise during the summer months. No one knows the normal activity of this neighborhood better than

the people living on these streets.

If you see any activity that seems out of place or experience anything unusual at your home or your neighbors, **call the police**. If it looks out of place, chances are good that it might be. You will not have to give your name or address. The non-emergency number for the **Columbus Police** Department is **645-4545** and they need our help in protecting this community. The **railroad bridge** at Morse and I-71 is being worked on prior to being repainted. The "concrete work" is the first part of the process. Painting will be the final step. The Transportation Department is reviewing the **curb repair request** made for a number of curbs in Maize Morse. Many of the crumbling curbs are to be replaced by September 2008. The project was left unfinished after our 2006 Neighborhood Pride Program due to a lack of funding. The city has begun making curbs with white arrows in anticipation of the project. Ohio Equities has been hired by the Morse Rd. SID to maintain the islands and rights-ofway on Morse Rd. from and including the I-71 interchange to one block east of Morse Rd.

A housing code violation can be reported by calling 645-3111 or inputting www.columbus.gov and click on the submit or *Check* a Service Request site next to the 311 logo and proceed. However, a citizen may certainly call me to ask for more information or to have me input the request for him or her as people sometimes would rather not do that themselves. Though it is a fourth degree misdemeanor for any city employee to reveal the name of a complainant, a complaint may be filed anonymously. Some folks still don't feel comfortable calling or e-mailing themselves, so I am happy to do it. Folks are free to call me with any questions Dick Graham 645-7371 they have.




