#### **HMCAI Celebrates 100 Years**

Historic Montclair Community Association celebrated its 100th Anniversary on the weekend of May 19-20th. HMCAI chose to mark the milestone with numerous events that highlighted the neighborhood, its many long-term residents, its historic buildings and the wonderful diversity of Montclair's present inhabitants. The weekend began with the open houses at Montclair's many churches and schools, including Montclair School, St. James Church and School, Montclair United Methodist Church, St. Luke's Episcopal Church and Paddington Station PreSchool (home of the original Montclair School and a recent addition to the National Register of Historic Places.)

The afternoon started with a standing room only crowd in the Molkery listening to Dr. Tom Noel and Bill Hansen

relate the history of Denver and Historic Montclair while presenting a very interesting slide show. It was truly wonderful to see pictures of the neighborhood's first homes, including the Richthofen Castle. The pictures were interesting for what was missing as well the trees. (Historic Montclair's many trees are so important to our quality of life and we all certainly owe our early founding citizens a debt of gratitude for planting them.) After the talk, the majority of attendees followed Bill and Tom on a fascinating history walk through the neighborhood. Saturday evening was capped off by a HMCAI members-only cocktail reception. The many attendees had a wonderful time visiting with old and new friends. It is important to note here that there is nothing better than a little cold wine or beer, coupled with great music and great friends, on the porches of the Molkery in the summer.

### **Recycle Your Glass**


Recycling glass bottles is a better choice than tossing them away. Glass bottles and jars are 100% recyclable and can be recycled into new containers repeatedly. Glass does not lose its quality or purity and can go from your recycling container back to the store shelf as a new bottle in as little as 30 days. (Glass Packaging Institute.)

A glass bottle made today would take more than one million years or longer to decompose in a landfill. (U.S. EPA). By recycling glass, you can also help to protect our environment. The energy alone saved from recycling one glass container can run a 100-watt light bulb for up to 4 hours (U.S. EPA).

Glass can be separated by color or mixed when recycled depending on available markets. The glass collected from Denver residents goes to Rocky Mountain Bottle Company in Westminster for recycling. Rocky Mountain Bottle Company processes more than 300 tons of glass a day. That's enough glass to go 40 rows high in Invesco Field in a year's time!

Be sure to recycle as many glass bottles and jars as you can in your purple recycling cart. Please don't contaminate the recyclable glass with non-recyclable glass, such as windows, ceramics, drinking glasses, mirrors, and light bulbs.

If you do not yet have a purple recycling cart, call 3-1-1 or visit **DenverGov.org/DenverRecycles**. There is no charge for the carts or for the twice-monthly pickups.

#### **Junk Mail Reduction**

Do you toss away piles of junk mail every week? Now there are two great ways to combat this waste stream: Reduce and Recycle. Denver Recycles offers a free Junk Mail Reduction Kit to Denver residents. The kit includes a series of pre-printed, pre-addressed postcards that you sent out to major direct mail marketing firms requesting your name and address be removed from their list. Also, you can visit Denver Recycles' website at **DenverGov.org/DenverRecycles** for on-line resources.

For that unwanted mail that still ends up in your mailbox, recycle it in your purple recycling cart at home. Junk mail such as opened mail, postcards, paper envelopes, (plastic windows are okay), flyers, and advertisements can all be recycled in your Denver Recycles' recycling cart. Just remember- no plastic wrappers, no fluorescent paper, and no polyethylene fiber envelopes such as some overnight mailing envelopes. Also, do not forget to remove, block out, or shred any personal information (SSN, driver's license number, credit card number, etc.) before placing the material in your recycling cart.


