

Amenity Area

Pool

Jim Atkeison distributed a copy of a memo from Ricky Biggs and Kevin Adams with Adams Pool. The work that Adams Pool had done to treat the spots in the plaster had been successful. Adams Pool recovered both pools today and Ricky Biggs will winterize both pools this weekend.


