




President's Comments - September, 2007

Water Meters

This is a subject that must be faced up to. Water and sewer costs are the second most expensive items in the budget, next to the interest payments on the mortgage.

Those residents who insist on using city water to water their plants and their lawns aggravate the excessive water expense. There is no doubt that leaks in the water distribution system also lead to a lot of water loss.



Provisions are being made in the budget to replace the deteriorating water pipes, and this program will commence after the zone valve program is finished.

We must also consider the environmental impact. Water is not an abundant commodity in Florida, and we must do what we can to help conserve the existing supplies, and limit our use to that which is necessary. The Florida State legislature considered a bill this year, that was not proceeded with, to require all communities such as condos, manufactured home parks etc. to have all dwellings metered, in an effort to reduce water wastage.

Clearly, when that legislation is passed, we will have no choice but to install meters, and one can easily surmise, that when such a program is mandatory, that the cost of installing meters will rise dramatically, when the contractors realize they have a captive market.

The Manager will fill you in on the actual plans to implement the program of installing meters. This plan envisions a reduction in maintenance fees and rental rates, and the water/sewer cost assumed by the resident.

The installation of meters requires membership approval, and this will be requested later this year.




Manager's Report

<u>Phone Books</u>: Please place old phonebooks out on trash pick-up days. Make sure they are separated from your garbage.

<u>Newspapers/Magazines</u>: Newspapers are to be placed in the newspaper bins located at two places: one on Mt. Piney Ave, the other on Americana Drive. Please **do not** put brown paper or plastic bags in these bins! <u>Magazines</u> may be placed in the storage area on Americana Drive. 





Famous Birthdays



September 1, 1923 - Boxing champ Rocky Marciano (1923-1969) was born in Brockton, Massachusetts (as Rocco Francis Marchegiano). He fought Jersey Joe Walcott for the heavyweight title on September 23, 1952, and knocked him out. In 1956, he retired as the only undefeated heavyweight champion. He died in a plane crash in 1969.

September 5, 1847 - Wild West legend Jesse James (1847-1882) was born in Centerville, Missouri. Following the U.S. Civil War, Jesse and his brother Frank formed a group of



outlaws, robbing banks, trains, stagecoaches and stores. In 1882, after the governor of Missouri offered a \$10,000 reward for their capture dead or alive, a member of the gang shot 34-year-old Jesse in the back of the head and claimed the reward.

September 7, 1533 - Queen Elizabeth I (1533-1603) was born in Greenwich Palace. She was the daughter of King Henry VIII and Anne Boleyn. She ascended the throne in 1558 at age 25. During her reign, Britain became a world power by defeating the Spanish Armada. The Anglican Church was also fully established.

September 12, 1913 - American Olympic athlete Jesse Owens (1913-1980) was born in Oakville, Alabama (as James Cleveland Owens). He won four medals in track and field at the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin, defeating Nazi athletes. Nazi leader Adolf Hitler stormed out of the stadium rather than present the medals to Owens, an African American.

September 15, 1890 - English mystery author Agatha Christie (1890-1976) was born in Torquay, England. She wrote nearly a hundred books including mysteries, dramas, poetry and nonfiction.

September 18, 1905 - Movie actress Greta Garbo (1905-1990) was born in Stockholm, Sweden (as Greta Lovisa Gustafsson). She retired and became a recluse after making 27 films, spanning the silent era through the beginning of sound movies.

September 24, 1936 - Puppeteer Jim Henson (1936-1990) was born in Greenville, Mississippi. He created the Muppets, including Kermit the Frog, and Bert and Ernie, entertaining and educating generations of American children via the daily TV show Sesame Street.

September 29, 1829 - England's "bobbies" made their first public appearance. Greater London's Metropolitan Police force was established by an act of Parliament at the request of Home Secretary, Sir Robert Peel, after whom they were nicknamed. The force later became known as Scotland Yard, the site of their first headquarters.







I sincerely hope that people will volunteer to help with these affairs. This will be a <u>dull season</u> indeed if people do not step forward.







Sheldon and I live at 7011 Mt. Hawthorne Rd. We have 2 sons; Chad, whose home is here in St. Pete, along with his wife and 2 sons and Clark, who is single and lives in the Minneapolis area. We



moved from Minneapolis to St. Pete on August 12,1984. We lived on Tanglewood Island for ten years then moved to Americana July 15, 1994.

We'd love to have you visit with us anytime. Our relationships there have been very supportive and satisfying during our entire 23 years in St. Pete.

We really enjoy living here in the park, but I don't have much opportunity to be involved in activities because I'm a full time teacher for Pinellas County Schools. In 1993 I was in desperate need of a job after having been a full time homemaker for 35 years. My job was miraculously created just for me that summer. My field is home economics education and at first I was hired to teach Adult Daily Living Skills to special needs adults in a regular classroom but a unique setting.

I work under the supervision of Lakewood Adult Community School but I am placed full time at the Louise Graham Regeneration Center, an Adult Day Training facility at 2301 3rd Av. S. for adults with developmental disabilities. Come visit us sometime! I am provided with a wonderful assistant, Gloria, who has 28 years of experience in this agency. It's a great honor for me to spend my work days in our local African-American community. Our intellectually challenged students range in age from 22 to 65 and have a functioning level from 2 years to about 2nd or 3rd grade.

When the LGRC agency moved to its present warehouse location our curriculum was changed to Workforce Development. Due to the current special education emphasis on community inclusion, the community has become our classroom. So we get to take the students out in the community every day to expose them to potential jobs and resources available to them. Under our supervision they test their work aptitudes and interests through volunteering at Bayfront Hospital Environmental Services and Lakewood H.S. Cafeteria Kitchen where they get a highly motivating free lunch for learning and practicing simple job skills.

They also volunteer at the Ronald McDonald House and Coquina Rehab Center.

We also get to take them out weekly to the library where we teach some to use the internet, others look at books and magazines, &/or check out books and movies. On payday we take them to the bank where they can learn to cash their paycheck and open a saving account.

We get to plan a plethora of educational field trips to places like the Mahaffey Theatre, police and fire station, aquarium, planetarium, zoo, museum, newspaper, post office, shopping mall, thrift store, power plant, waste plant, park, airport, bowling alley, restaurant, Pier, tour, etc. I'm so grateful to enjoy work that I both need and love.








September is Better Breakfast Month




