Coomer Creek Honors Firefighters at Local Stations

Coomer Creek Neighborhood Association held its 4th Annual 9-11 Firemen's Feast for the 2 fire stations that serve the residents; Station 7 on Naaman School Rd. and Station 11 on Beltline. This event is held annually in appreciation and in memory of 9-11. Leslie Jones was the project coordinator, and 16 homeowners and 4 local merchants enjoyed participating. Leslie joins and encourages the other associations, clubs and individuals who also provide for their local first responders.

On Sunday September 9th, Garland suffered heavy rains. The men had just returned from 2 house fires and many high water rescues. Dinner was waiting for them when they returned. Both stations, despite the strenuous and wet circumstances, gave tours and showed off the equipment and their training, while trying to store all the food for all 3 shifts.

The menu included donations of cash to purchase items that might be needed. This year, we were blessed with local merchant donations by **Pizza Hut** (hot wings), **Swif-T Convenience store** (sodas), **Mexicali's Café** (fajitas), and **The Takery** (potato's au gratin casseroles). **The Coomer Creek cooks** sent over Ooey Gooey brownies, chicken & broccoli casseroles, ice cream with sundae fixin's, candy, lasagna, tossed salads, mac & cheese, homemade rolls, hamburger casseroles, a large variety of 11 cakes and desserts, ice cream, Starbucks coffee, sodas, bottled water, and popcorn. An equal amount went to each station as our thanks for serving our community and to honor their fallen brothers and sisters.
