Your December Safety Message From the Tucson Fire Department

The holidays are a very busy time of year. Most people get so involved with decorating their homes and preparing for festivities that they forget to take basic safety precautions. The Tucson Fire Department suggests the following safety tips this holiday season:

CHRISTMAS TREES:

Select a tree that is fresh and not showing signs of dryness. Cut the base before putting the tree in water and check the water level daily. Keep trees away from heat sources such as fireplaces, heating vents or radiators, as they tend to dry out branches. Remove and RECYCLE your tree quickly after the holidays and never attempt to burn your Christmas tree or its branches in your fireplace.

LIGHTS AND CANDLES:

Decorate using only UL approved lights and cords. Inspect the lights for exposed or frayed wires, loose connections or broken sockets. Use no more than three strings of lights on one extension cord, and never run cords under carpet, across doorways, or through windows where the cord may be pinched and damaged. Turn off the tree lights when you go to bed or leave the house. Keep burning candles, matches and lighters out of children's reach and do not place candles near draperies, decorations, or anything that may easily catch fire. Never leave a child unsupervised in a room with a burning candle. Extinguish all candles before leaving a room or going to bed.

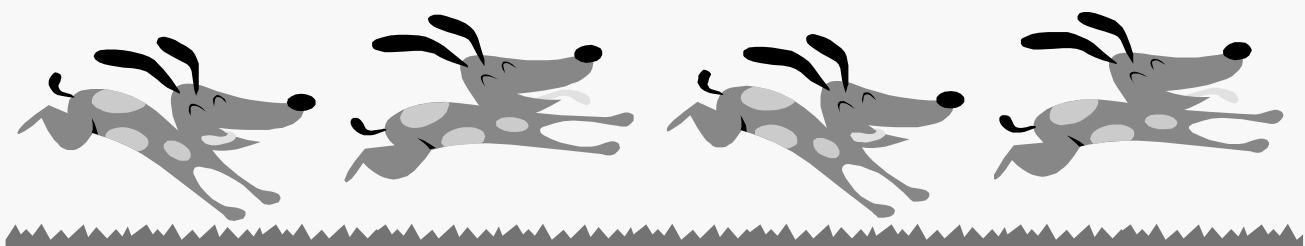

REMOVE ALL decorations, tinsel and the stand

You CAN Recycle Your Christmas Tree @ Rillito Race Track 1st Ave at River Rd.
Follow the signs to just east of the Grandstands

(Cut trees only – No live trees accepted)
