Speed Bumps?

Another, more permanent, measure that has proven effective in other Tulsa neighborhoods is the placement of speed bumps, or, more correctly, traffic calming devices. These devices are designed to allow vehicles to pass over safely at speeds up to 25 mph.

Some of our neighbors on 104th (just south of 23rd Place) have requested the street to be equipped with these devices, due to speeding along the street. However, in order to place these, a review will need to be made by the city to see if the street meets the requirement for placement of the devices.

Storm Debris Removal Tips

- Drag tree debris of any size to the curb and stack it just behind the curb where trucks with mechanical grappling arms can reach it. Do NOT stack debris on utility meters, telephone or cable switch boxes or too close to fences or mailboxes.
- Debris piles which are too large to fit between sidewalks and curbs can still be picked up. But separate piles outside of
 the curb area or right-of-way areas will not be picked up. Any such piles missed during the first pass of the haulers
 through neighborhoods should then be moved to the curb where it will be picked up on a later pass.
- Do NOT place debris in the streets or protruding into the streets.
- Do NOT park cars in streets where debris is piled at the curb. Contractors cannot pick up and dispose of debris if vehicles are in front of the piles or are so close that they might be damaged by flying or falling debris.
