# Mosquito prevention tips

- The best way to prevent West Nile is to be sure you are not harboring mosquito breeding sites. ELIMINATE STANDING WATER
- Repellents containing DEET and some natural repellents are effective for varying periods of time. Check the product information to determine which repellent is best for you.
- Long sleeves and long pants, even in the summertime, are a good way of avoiding mosquito bits during the periods of high mosquito activity.
- Window and door screens need to be in good repair. Check for holes or cracks.
- Avoid outdoors when mosquitoes are out

## Report Graffiti

Work with your neighbors and your neighborhood association to be the eyes and ears for your community. Please take part and help report graffiti, don't wait for someone else to do it.

Graffiti cannot always be prevented, but property owners and residents can reduce the incidence of graffiti on building exteriors and walls by having good lighting and uncomfortable vegetation in place.

Putting graffiti on public or private property is against the law. If you see someone in the act of "tagging," call **911**. If the graffiti is already in place, call **792-CITY (792-2489)** or email **graffiti@tucsonaz.gov** to report it. Graffiti left in place tends to attract more graffiti.

Barrio Blue Moon is one of Tucson's older neighborhoods and was named after the "Blue Moon Ballroom" a dance hall which opened in 1920 and was very popular until it burned down on March 16, 1947. Entertainers, Billy Eckstien, Paul Whitman and Tommy Dorsey performed at the "Blue Moon".

Many longtime residents recall dancing there which they describe as a large barn with wooden window flaps that were pulled up at night so the cooling air could enter.
