So far 2008 seems to be a continuous repeating cycle of one nice day of weather followed by some form of frozen precipitation and six days of miserable cold, and another primary. Board members' discussions have similarly followed a repeating set of topics: pool parking lot repair, pending changes to the neighborhood covenants, and roofing issues. Maybe not the most exciting of subjects, but all are related to the reason the Board exists: to preserve and enhance our property values. Given the choice I would prefer a more entertaining set of subjects, something like Spring Break destinations, early retirement, or recent Orange Bowl victories. So it goes.

Welcome to Our Newest Board Member

Good progress has been made on several of the Board's agenda topics, which I would like to update you on. Before I do that I would like to first welcome Al Moser to the Windham Park Board. Al was elected to the Board at January's annual meeting, and takes the role of heading up the "Social, Safety and Community Relations" position. Please join me in welcoming Al to the Board, and thanking him for his neighborhood commitment.

Updates to the Covenants

After several iterations (hopefully) the final draft of the neighborhood covenants have gone to the attorney for review. A vote will be required of all homeowners to approve the suggested changes, which we intend to do in conjunction with distribution of new pool keys. Some of the changes the Board is proposing include:

Provide more latitude in certain building materials permitted (such as allowing wrought iron fencing instead of only wood)

Simplify procedure for updating neighborhood restrictions (currently permitted only once every 20 years)

Removal of language specific to the de-

veloper (Rodrock had substantial control before all lots were sold, but the text is no longer necessary now that all lots are occupied)

Addition of options for responding to homes that fall into substantial disrepair (We will continue to expect the city of Overland Park to take the lead in code enforcement, but the proposed changes will give the homeowner's association an option if other enforcement avenues don't work)

Roof Replacement

There have been a handful of instances of what appears to be some questionable tactics by one or more roofing companies. At least one company has told homeowners they have pre-approved shingle types/ colors with the Board, when in fact they have not. Also, some homeowners have been promised a "free roof" once the roofing company submits an insurance hail damage claim on their behalf; even promising no deductible. As the saying goes, if it sounds too good to be true it probably is. The Architectural Control Committee is developing a list of pre-approved shingles (brands, styles and colors) to make it easier for homeowners to work with roofing contractors in getting an approved roof installed. Please remember all roof replacements must be approved in advance (see www.windhampark.org to obtain an "Architectural Review Form").

Architectural Review Reminders

Now that spring is upon us and summer is right around the corner, home improvement projects are on everyone's mind. Please remember that if you plan to make ANY alterations to the exterior of your home, you must first receive approval from the Association's Architectural Control Committee (ACC). The Committee is comprised of a group of volunteer homeowners that are committed to maintaining the visual integrity and property values of homes in Windham Park by ensuring that all improvements are within the guidelines and restrictions of the Association. Examples of improvements needing approval include but are not limited to:

Decks
Fencing
Pools/Hot Tubs
Room Additions
Roofs

Major Landscaping Exterior Painting Basketball Goals Play Equipment/Swing sets

Once you've made the decision to make an improvement to the exterior of your home, you must fill out a Architectural request forms. Architectural request forms can be found at the community website at http://www.neighborhoodlink.com/overlndprk/windhampark/

Your request will be reviewed and typically you can expect a response within ten-(10) days. However, more extensive projects may take more time to review so please plan ahead. Please include as much information with your request as possible including photos, drawings and actual samples of products if possible.

Pool Parking Lot Update

The concrete parking lot at the pool is crumbling. After interviewing contractors, reviewing bids and proposals, and inspecting several lots from new to old, the board members are leaning toward an asphalt overlay. All lot overlays that I have seen are in GREAT condition and show no signs of patching or deterioration. It seems to be true that asphalt installed over the top of concrete holds up extremely well where as asphalt by itself doesn't. (As we all know.)

The cost considerations are as follows:

- Tearing out and installing new concrete will cost up to \$45k.
- Overlaying the concrete with asphalt will cost up to \$12K.

We've also looked into replacing only a part of the concrete lot. After interviewing contractors and inspecting the lot with concrete contractors, there is much more deterioration than meets the inexperienced eye and "most" of the lot needs replaced anyway. When trying to tear out and patch there wouldn't be a good stopping point and the association will, in the end, be stuck holding the bill for a "most" or "complete" replacement.

According to our management company, Curry Management, when one looks at what other neighborhoods do, it is more the "norm" to have a pool parking lot in asphalt.

Thank you and congratulations to all Salvation Army Bell-Ringers this past Christmas season. Because of you, at our Hy-Vee bell-ringing site at 135th and Antioch we took in \$17,384.05 -- that's a 30% increase over 2006 donations! In addition, our site was second highest in total donations of the 200-some bell-ringing sites in the entire metropolitan area. The main reason for our success is the bell-ringing site was manned totally by volunteers during the Salvation Army's bell-ringing season – that's six days a week, 8-10 hours a day from November 9th through December 24th. More than 90% of that \$17,384.05 stays in the Kansas City area and goes toward feeding and housing people, helping them get through difficult times and helping them get jobs.

On behalf of the Salvation Army and all of us, thank you so very much for volunteering your time.


