## Important Information About Water Restrictions

Since September 26, 2007, we have been under mandatory water restrictions. Even with the rain we've received this winter, the mandatory restrictions continue today. The amended water use restrictions in Mecklenburg are as follows:

- \* Lawn watering and the operation of any sprinkler system are prohibited at all times.
- \* Residential car washing is not allowed.
- \* The operation of ornamental fountains (without fish) is not allowed.

#### Can pools be filled?

Current water restrictions prohibit the filling or re-filling of poolt. Pool owners and operators can, however, top off pool water levels. Charlotte Mecklenburg Utilities recommends cleaning the water still in pools as a means of cleaning and prepping for summer use.

## **Now is Planting Time for Vegetables**

- 1) Prepare the vegetable garden by adding compost and working it into the soil.
- 2) Plant asparagus crowns this month when soil is dry enough to work.
- 3) Prepare to sow beets, carrots, peas, lettuce, mustard, radish, spinach, Irish potatoes and turnips early in February.
- 4) Grow cold-tolerant leafy vegetables such as lettuce, spinach and collards. Some may be killed by frost, but it's worth it to have fresh greens for salads. Try planting greens with pansies for a pretty winter salad garden.
- 5) Watering just before a cold snap will help plants survive bitter temperatures.
- 6) Most houseplants are semi-dormant at this time of the year; don't fertilize them.

#### **Rain Barrel Sale Policies:**

- •Due to lack of storage space, no alternate pick-ups can be scheduled
- •All returns & equipment defects must go through manufacturer, RainBarrelUSA
- •Any extra barrels will be sold off at the end of each sale, we cannot release barrels before the end of our advertised pick-up times
- Switching sizes of barrels at the sale is prohibited. Any changes must wait until the end of the sale.

#### **Rain Barrel Description:**

- Dark Green
- •Approximate Dimensions: 60 Gallon 32"H x 28"W 80 Gallon 38"H x 28"W
- Locking lid & aluminum screen prevent pests from entering
- Works with any size downspout
- Each barrel has spigot and 2 overflow valves
- The dark colors of the barrels block the light to reduce algae growth. A locking lid stops wildlife and pets from entering the barrels, including mosquitoes!
- The Rain Barrel also has an overflow valve that can be attached to a garden hose to divert the overflow water to any area of your yard that needs it.
- A one inch rainfall over a 1000 square foot roof provides over 620 gallons of water. With the overflow valve you can direct this water to your garden or any other area of your yard.
- RainBarrelUSA is the manufacturer of our rain barrels. They are located in Waxhaw, NC. Visit their website for more pictures of the rain barrels and other items they manufacture for them. Feel free to contact them directly with any technical questions about the barrels.
