As always, LHNA membership is open to ALL households in Lakewood Heights.

The mission of LHNA is to promote a desirable neighborhood environment and character, and take action on common concerns affecting us. First and foremost, LHNA is YOUR voice and advocate to activate City and community efforts for the safety, protection, beautification, well-being, and vitality of Lakewood Heights.

LHNA provides a forum - through membership meetings, our newsletters, and events - for discussion of and action on efforts important to you. A primary goal is to inform and bring neighbors together with the belief that strength of neighborhood comes from knowing each other and in supporting common goals and needs. Our many events and programs provide fun and meaningful ways to express our interests and get to know each other. We continually focus on safety & crime watch, zoning & code issues, street conditions, traffic, recycling, property upkeep, tree planting, and Tietze Park. As the neighborhood grows and new neighbors and families join in active participation, new talents and knowledge allows our events and offerings to expand as well.

Your annual dues and fund raising efforts make all this possible. They fund distribution of the quarterly newsletter, fliers, and website. They make all our events possible. Your membership brings you and your family several added benefits for Crime Watch, e-communications, & event notification. To vote on LHNA issues you must be a current paid member. All residents are encouraged to attend quarterly meetings in March, July, and October to bring us fresh ideas and share neighborhood updates. DHL & the New Neighborhood Matching Fund

As a Board member of the Dallas Homeowners League, and president of Lakewood HTs Neighborhood Association, I've been serving with other community volunteers to develop an exciting new program, the Neighborhood Matching Fund This program follows the lead of progressive cities and other national grassroots community organizations who understand the value and power of partnering to maximize local benefits! Jim Diers, a Seattle community organizer and visionary, created the model for the NMF. It has been so successful in making projects happen that he is helping develop similar programs all over the world! He presented his concept and success story during the DHL Boot Camp workshops in August, 2007. (In fact, we are hoping to get him back for this year's Boot Camp!)

He describes the program as one in which the "city provides funding in exchange for the community's match of an equal value in cash, volunteer labor, and/or donated goods and services in support of citizen-initiated projects." NMF program has resulted in over 3000 neighborhood-led projects involving tens of thousands of volunteers since 1989, while doubling the city's \$45 million investment.

During our efforts over the passed several months to formulate our own program, we have identified parameters for what might define eligible projects, who can apply (and who can't), project criteria, as well as the basic structure for who decides what projects would get funding for implementation. More work is needed to finalize our proposal for this new program, but we hope to do so soon to begin working with City leaders for support so that we can present it to the Mayor mid-year. Stay tuned!

Mayor Tom Leppert Presents 2008 Goals at Lakewood Event

In February, our Texas State Representative and LHNA member, the honorable Allen Vaught, invited Chris Moseley, Palo Pinto neighbor and Melanie Vanlandingham, LHNA President, to join him at the Dallas Northeast Chamber of Commerce Annual Banquet at the Lakewood Country Club. At the meeting, Congressman Pete Sessions spoke and Mayor Tom Leppert presented his goals for Education, Crime Prevention, and Economic Development for 2008. the highlights:

- Education: while DISD governs education in Dallas, the City has begun a program of incentives for staying in school, targeted especially toward 9th graders. These include scholarships, reading programs at neighborhood libraries, and a new program of mentorship and internships with Dallas businesses.
- Crime Prevention: Of particular interest for us, the Mayor is committed to hiring more officers to get us more in line with other major cities, and to stronger local policing in neighborhoods.
- Economic Development: In 2008, focus will be on building opportunities in downtown and Oak Cliff particularly along the Trinity River corridor. Sparked interest for development due to planned park and transportation improvements along the river have already begun. The mayor spoke on keeping and building this momentum. Of interest to neighborhoods are his initiatives for GREENING Dallas, which are linked to the economic and environmental health of Dallas. In January, Dallas launched its GREEN DALLAS website GREEN DALLAS.NET with tips on how to save water and energy, recycling, maintaining a "green" lawn and landscape, and improving air quality. The Green Initiatives may also have impact on increased park improvements, tree planting, and walkable community development.

Following the meeting, our Lakewood Heights attendees took the opportunity to discuss with the Mayor the importance of these goals right here in your own neighborhood. We thank Rep. Vaught for his continued focus on neighborhood and community quality of life and for the opportunity to join him in the Chamber event!

LHNA Officers, Street Representatives, and Committees

Any member wishing to hold an office needs to notify the Secretary, Mark Dressendorfer (214-827-1124), prior to the March 20rd Membership meeting. Nominations during the meeting also may be made and shall be accepted.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS:

The President shall call and preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the membership, and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors. The President shall be a regular member of the Board of Directors and an ex officio member of all permanent committees. The president shall represent the association in its relations with persons and organizations outside the association. The President shall insure that each Committee leader understands their operating responsibilities and the mission of their committee. The president shall be responsible for monitoring and reporting to the membership any activities of the various City Boards and Commissions that affect or potentially affect the Lakewood Heights area.

The Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President at the President's request, or whenever the President is absent or unable to perform the duties of that office, and shall perform such other duties as the Board of Directors may prescribe. Upon a vacancy in the office of President, the Vice-President shall assume the Presidency and the Board shall fill the Vice-Presidency. The Vice-President shall serve as Parliamentarian for all Board and Membership meetings of the association.

The Secretary shall keep a record of minutes of all meetings of the Board of Directors and the General Membership, keep record of all important documents, correspondence and newsletters and shall perform such other duties as the Board of Directors may prescribe. The Board may appoint one or more assistant Secretaries.

The Treasurer shall collect dues and have custody of association funds, pay bills within approved budgets, keep an accurate record of all receipts and expenditures, prepare a written financial report to be given at the March membership meeting, and perform such other duties as the Board of Directors may prescribe. The Board may appoint one or more Assistant Treasurers.

The Street Representatives shall act as liaison between the Board and residents of their respective streets and shall be ex officio members of the Membership, Events, and Communications committees. Street Representatives deliver the LHNA Heights Herald newsletter and serve on committees as determined by the Board of Directors.

PERMANENT COMMITTEE CHAIRS:

The Zoning Committee- monitoring of any application for rezoning, replatting, or variances from zoning which may be filed within, or may otherwise affect, the neighborhood area.

The Crimewatch Committee- organization of "CrimeWatch" areas within LH and cooperating with the Dallas Police Department implementing programs for enhanced neighborhood security.

The Communications Committee- shall be responsible for a) establishing and maintaining a phone committee to be used in the rapid notification of the membership of developments of importance

to the association and for b) publishing a newsletter at least quarterly. Includes the LHNA website administration.

The Membership Committee- obtaining, retaining of members in the association, assisting the Treasurer in collection of dues.

The Neighborhood Services Committee- shall be responsible for overseeing the delivery of neighborhood services to the area including, but not limited to, public transportation, public streets and utilities, street lighting and garbage and refuse collection; and for identifying and assisting in the rehabilitation of properties whose owners, for reasons of ill health or advanced age, are unable to adequately maintain their properties. Coordinates Neighborhood Emergency Preparedness Plan.

Membership in any permanent committee shall be open to any member of the association, without limitation as to the number of committees a member may join.

A Leader for each permanent committee shall be elected by the Board of directors to serve for one operating year.

The Board may establish Special Committees in addition to the Permanent Committees and shall appoint Leader for each such committee.

SPECIAL COMMITTEE CHAIRS

The Events Committee shall plan, organize, and conduct official association events. Officers and Street Reps shall be ex officio members.

The Fund Raising Committee shall plan, organize, and conduct fund raising activities as needed and determined by the Board for events, programs, and official business of the association. The Treasurer shall be an ex officio member.

The Park Committee shall work with LHNA Board and membership, the City of Dallas, Friends of Tietze Park Foundation, and other organizations to ensure that improvements, maintenance, operations, programming, and events meet the LHNA resident needs. The Crime Watch Committee Chair shall be an ex officio member.

The Traffic Committee shall work with the LHNA Board, City of Dallas Police and City Council to report traffic safety and trafficrelated issues occurring with Lakewood Heights. The CrimeWatch Committee Chair shall be an ex officio member.

Rights of Members. Each member of the association is eligible to serve as an officer or on any committee of the association, to vote on matters as provided in these Articles, to receive a copy of the newsletter, and to attend (with any member of his or her household) any business or social function of the association.


