Important Alert

County Hearing Requested by the Rock Church

While finalizing announcements for our January 2008 WHOA newsletter, we were just informed that The Rock Church has requested a hearing with our County Planning and Zoning Staff. The Rock also filed a revised ODP along with their hearing request. This hearing will be in early January. It will be scheduled in the evening. Once we know the definite date and time, we will notify you immediately. In the meantime, it is critical that all interested and committed Westridge residents plan to attend this hearing.

Your genuine opposition can be determined **only** by your presence and voice at this hearing.

Shoveling Snow

Let's Talk . . .

(An Update on The Rock Church's Expansion Efforts)

The Westridge HOA continues to oppose the efforts of The Rock Church to build a mega-church in our neighborhood. Thank you to all who signed the petition that was recently sent around Westridge and Reflections. Anyone who was missed and would like to sign the petition now should contact the HOA, and we will send someone to your home to collect your signature. At this point, over 500 voters have signed the petition. These signatures will show the Jefferson County Commissioners how much we care about maintaining the quiet, traffic-free neighborhood that we currently live in.

As you may already know, on October 2nd, the Jefferson County Planning Department formally responded to The Rock's latest development plan. The Department again stated that they would not support The Rock's rezoning proposal if it was submitted to the County Commissioners, as it was not compatible with the surrounding neighborhood. After this latest rejection, The Rock's architect contacted the County Zoning Department, inquiring as to whether Denver residential zoning rules might apply to their vacant

parcel of land (due to the failed Denver annexation attempt in the 1970s). Under Denver zoning, The Rock potentially would be allowed to develop the property with very few limitations. Fortunately, the Jefferson County Zoning Department clarified that the Jefferson County original Official Development Plan (ODP) applies to the lot – not Denver zoning. The Rock now has hired an attorney and is requesting information from the county as

to whether any other construction in our neighborhood has been allowed under Denver zoning. Westridge HOA believes that this is an attempt to gain leverage for the upcoming hearings, and also to prepare for potential lawsuits

y against the County if The Rock's rezoning plan is denied.

Once again, The Rock has shown that it does not care about the welfare of the neighborhood – they are willing to try anything to get their mega-church built!

The Rock has not yet requested a hearing before the County Commissioners for their rezoning plan. The HOA will contact you once hearing dates have been set. Please remember that it is very important for each of you to attend these hearings!

Westridge Elementary Kindergarten Registration for 2008-2009

Kindergarten registration will begin on Monday, January 14, 2008 from 8 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. The age requirement for Jefferson County Schools is age 5, prior to October 1, 2008. In order to register your child, you will need to bring a birth certificate, proof of address, and record of immunization (including evidence of Hepatitis B immunization). When you register you will be able to indicate your preference for a morning class (8:25 – 11 a.m., 5 days per week), an afternoon class (12:30 – 3 p.m., 5 days per week), or a full day tuition-based session (8:25 a.m. – 3 p.m., 5 days per week). Tuition for this class is \$310.00 per month (subject to possibe change). These requests are honored on a first come, first served basis.

For families not living in the Westridge neighborhood, a Choice Enrollment form must be completed. First Round Choice enrollment begins on Tuesday, January 8, 2008 and runs through January 24, 2008. Forms can be picked up at Westridge Elementary, or you can go to the enrollment website at http://jeffcoweb.jeffco.k12.co.us/enrollment/ and download a form. Second Round is from February 16th – August 30th, 2008. Please call the school office at (303) 982-3975 with further questions.



Working Outdoors

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration warns that winter brings its own hazards, particularly for outdoor workers. Here are some of its safety suggestions:

- Learn the signs and symptoms of cold-induced illnesses and injuries. These include fatigue, uncontrolled shivering, bluish skin, slurred speech, clumsy movements, and irritable or irrational behavior.
- Use the buddy system and work in pairs so one worker can recognize danger signs in the other.
- Dress in layers that can be adjusted for changing conditions.
- Try to schedule outdoor work for the warmest part of the day.
- Take short breaks in warm shelters to warm up and to avoid exhaustion.
- Drink warm, sweet beverages and avoid caffeinated drinks. Eat hot, high-calorie foods, such as pasta dishes.
