## The Waters of Monument Beach

After a year of delay and much frustration, the boat ramp and area under the Toby Island bridge has been dredged. The County dredge "Codfish" did the work. This will allow vessels to be launched at low tide, resulting in less damage to boats and trailers. By dredging under the bridge, Little Bay can now have tidal flushing continuously. The sand that was removed has been used to replenish the beach and after some raking and redistribution, should result in much improvement for bathers.

In recent years, silting had been building up to a point where there was little water movement under the bridge. This could lead to excess nitrogen in the water, algae build-up and possibly affect the shellfish. By restoring the flow of water, more nutrients should be available for one of the prime shellfish areas in Bourne. In the past, Little Bay held scallops, quahogs, soft shelled clams (steamers) and oysters. The DNR has been working to restore some of these resources. Last year, a new oyster bed was established with oysters relayed from the Pocasset River.

Unfortunately, there were a few problems encountered that made the job more difficult than expected. The water main to Toby Island was installed in the early 1950s, at about the time the Town acquired the area for public use, and the pipe's exact location was unknown. While improving the depth of the waters just inside the bay from the bridge, the pipe was ruptured. The water company said this was of an older, composition type and quite brittle. A new water main was laid from Emmons Road, under the channel, and well into the island. There should not be any doubt about it's location in the future.

While working on repairing the water pipe, one of the vehicles bumped into the utility pole feeding electricity to the island. It seems the pole was pretty rotten and snapped. Power was lost for about nine hours but now a new pole is installed. At least the residents of Toby Island will have some improved utilities.

With the rebuilding of the dock, painting and repairs to the marina, removal of some of the invasive brush and restoration of the beach and some of our natural resources, the waters of Monument Beach have had a good year.

#### Who are the Bourne Braves?

We are part of the **Cape Cod Baseball League**, the #1 summer collegiate league in the country where 1 out of 7 **MLB** baseball players have their roots. 
