





Picture: Auburn Creek as it traverses from University to Euclid Avenue.



Spaniard settlers and first Californians named this Kumeyaay, Native Americans, known creek "Río Castaño" [Chestnut Brown] for the color of its waters.

This name was later translated by modern Americans to "Auburn Creek". Due to urbanization, when the creek was canalized to the west, the newly built street, atop the soft bottom of the creek, was named "Auburn Drive", as it exist today.





- n This § is used in the neighborhood to demo entire structures without historical review, lead paint containment and the increase destruction of neighborhood character and scale.
- we will work to change present policy on final inspections and permit signoff.


