## CANA CRIME WATCH EMAIL LIST

To subscribe to the Colonial Acres area crime watch email service provided by a loyal neighbor, send an email to dyawn@memphisdailynews.com and you'll be added to the email distribution list. When someone sees or learns of a crime in our area, they write David and he forwards the email to everyone on the list. This list now reaches almost 500 concerned area residents. It's a great way to keep up with what's going on around your home or business. We spot crime patterns with this information and use it to prevent them and stay alert.

### MEMPHIS POLICE CYBERWATCH EMAIL LIST

Go online to memphispolice.org and click on the CyberWatch link on the menu on the left and fill out the required information. You can receive daily emails from the MPD on crimes within up to a 3 mile range of your house or any address in Memphis. This is another great awareness tool to stay current on what's going on around your area.

#### MULTI-PURPOSE BICYCLING

#### **NEW ENVIRONMENTAL COURT**

A new environmental court is scheduled to open in early April in the Ridgeway Police Precinct. This court will serve not only the neighborhoods of that precinct, but the Mt. Moriah Police Precinct as well.

Judge Larry Potter will preside there twice a month, and the procedural changes he has implemented should make it easier for violators to be prosecuted. In the past, citations for code violations could only be issued by code enforcement officers, but six police officers from the Mt. Moriah Station and police officers from the Ridgeway Station have recently received training in code enforcement. They now have the authority to issue citations for overgrown yards, parking in the grass, loud noise, tractor-trailers parked on residential streets, etc. Some violations that occur only at night and on weekends should be easier to prosecute now.

Please continue to report code violations to the Police and Citizens' Alliance (PACA) located in the Mt. Moriah Precinct, 795-3131, or through canacodes@bellsouth.net. The MPD's Ridgeway Station is located at 3840 Ridgeway Road, phone 901-576-4500.

#### **CRIME PREVENTION TIPS**

- Leave car keys by your bed at night. Use the Panic button on the remote control to set off your car alarm in case of emergency.
- ALWAYS lock your doors when you're outside. Many in our area have been burglarized while outside in their own yards.
- Install an alarm system.
- Upgrade your system with a cellular backup so if burglars cut your phone line, the system can still alert the alarm company and police.
- Use timers on lights and radios when not at home to help deter criminals.
- Let your neighbors know when you'll be away so they can get your mail, your newspaper, and keep an eye on your house.
- Keep the police advised of all suspicious activity by calling 545-COPS (545-2677).

#### WHERE IS COLONIAL ACRES?

The Colonial Acres Neighborhood Association represents residents living within the area bounded by Park Avenue on the north, Cherry Road on the west, Mt Moriah on the east, and I-240 on the south. As indicated in the map at right, CANA has been subdivided into seven colored zones, with the pink and blue zones north of Quince Road and the blue and orange zones east of Colonial Road. Close to 3,800 residents live in this neighborhood area.
