#### **President's Message**

Some of your neighbors ask: "Why bother joining the Valencia Homeowner's Association? Does it do anything for me?"

Our homeowner's association actively works to keep the quality of life within the neighborhood high for both homeowners and renters. Some of the benefits of having an active neighborhood association that you may not be aware of:

- As a recognized Homeowner's Association within District 10, we have direct contact with Councilman John Clamp's office. Representatives of the association have been invited to report concerns unique to the neighborhood directly to the District 10 office. Representatives have also been invited to meet in a more intimate setting with the Councilman to communicate needs of the neighborhood.
- ➤ Contact with our San Antonio Police SAFFE officer. As an Association, we have a designated neighborhood community officer. The association is used as the contact point to request help with neighborhood issues including code compliance, graffiti and other issues of concern. Our SAFFE officer has been a frequent speaker to the association and recently spoke to our COPs volunteers.
- Access to training and programs from the City of San Antonio to assist ourselves with neighborhood issues. Representatives of the association have attended training on accessing city resources, and the most recent training offered on combating graffiti.

The more visible part of our association is our social and member's activities:

Second Friday-- Every Second Friday we offer a neighborhood event that is fun for all.

Recently our Second Friday events have been "Movies Under the Stars". Nothing is nicer than sitting in a lawn chair under the stars watching a great movie with good neighbors and munching on fresh popcorn. Our movie nights continue, come out and try it sometime!

We have also offered Karaoke Nights when both kids and adults can be a star for a moment. We have some very talented neighbors who can really "wow" an audience. The rest of us just try really hard and we would love to have you join us!

On-going bike rides -- Come ride with your neighbors after the sun has gone down. Check out how nice our community is and how wonderful we make it together.



VHOA signed up SAWS customers for almost 400 water-saving toilets. These toilets save about 1 million gallons of water a year for each 100 toilets installed. Through this effort the VHOA saved over 3 million gallons of water in District 10.

#### Valencia Has a Band

Flatfoot Susie is a blues-rock trio in Northeast San Antonio that is fronted by guitarist/singer/songwriter Michael Mitchell of the Valencia Subdivision. Mitchell began playing guitar at the age of 4 and first played professionally at the age of 12. He has played with many bands during the last 20 years. Flatfoot Susie's bass player is an accomplished multi-instrumentalist named Brent Ferguson, who teaches Jazz Composition at Texas State University. He is 22 years old and is a dynamic stage presence. ## Valencia Neighborhood Association ....why you should be a member

There are two of levels of participation this year. In the past we only offered a full privilege membership that cost \$75.00 each year. With plans to resurface the tennis courts, and to offer many fun activities aimed at increasing quality of life in your neighborhood, we hope residents will see the value in a paid membership. With a goal of keeping all of our residents informed, we offer email updates and newsletters delivered to your door regardless of membership dues. We would however like to encourage you to join at the full price membership level, that gives you access to all the great things that we will offer this year, and allows us to continue to operate as a great neighborhood association.

#### Description/Annual Dues/Benefits

<u>Email, \$0.00</u>, The best and most timely way to share important neighborhood information is through email. This level allows us to do just that with all residents, regardless of membership in the VHOA. This level is available to anyone in Valencia or neighboring areas who provides the association with contact information, including an email address. Valencia will never share your contact information with any other organizations. This level includes invitations to the annual National Night Out event held in conjunction with the San Antonio Police Department.

Resident Membership, \$75.00, This level would include all of the benefits listed above as well as invitations to club events. These events would include such activities as game nights, movie nights, bicycle rides, group walking, wine tasting events, and neighborhood cookouts/dinners held at the club house for members only. The full membership would also include access to the tennis courts, the ability to rent the club house, and special cookouts targeted towards our membership.

<u>Associate Membership, \$85.00</u>, This level is for NON-Residents who join solely for the purpose of renting our clubhouse.
