



Remember absolutely **no guests** are permitted to use the **exercise room** because of liability issues.



Well, we can't say we haven't been educated and informed in April. There have been E-Mails, mailings and meetings to open the lines of communication. Wide open!



We received our financial report in the mail and found that "our business" was sound. A special Board Meeting was called and we learned that the Board, the lawyers and the DBPR are working towards a solution to the lot classification dilemma.

On April 8th, our own Finance Committee, Don Delzell, Wayne Brownlee, Nelson French and Michael MacDonald presented a loan-refinancing proposal. The task force explained in detail early renewal, significantly improved terms and the importance of timing. They solicited proposals from 10 banks and received written proposals from 5 banks. We appreciated and were impressed by their Power Point presentation and their detailed hard work.

Then an educational presentation on April 9th from Nu-Flow offered a solution to restoring our fresh water pipes using a pipe lining system. According to the speaker there is minimal disruption to the Park and the streets. We need all the information we can get to decide on a permanent solution.

On the 16th, at the regular Board Meeting, the refinancing of our loan was approved. The board also voted to limit attendance at *Maroa Board Meetings* to share holders, their spouses and Board invited guests. Finally, the RAAC proposal for settlement was rejected.

Gail Jones, Marketing, suggested that residents stop by the office to pick up some of our new brochures to distribute.

Councilman Jim Kennedy of District 2, visited to inform us of intent to locate a playground and dog park not too far north of the park.

I would like to express my appreciation to all who have worked hard to improve our conditions and to educate us in the process.






chicken and scrumptious desserts rounded out the spread and our bellies.

Victoria Day, May 24



England's Queen Victoria, born on May 24, 1837, was the ruling sovereign when Canada's provinces joined together to form a country in 1867, but even before confederation, Canadians celebrated her birthday. On May 24, 1854, 5,000 Canadian residents gathered in front of the Government House in Toronto, ON, to "give cheers to their queen." Throughout the years, Victoria Day has also been called Empire Day and Commonwealth Day. Several Canadian cities hold parades and firework displays in honor of the federal holiday (technically on the Monday before May 25); the largest celebration is held in the monarch's namesake city of Victoria, BC. At federal buildings, airports, and military bases that have two flag poles, the British Royal Union Flag — commonly called the Union Jack — is flown alongside the Canadian flag from sunrise to sunset to mark this day (—Provided by FirstDraft)




