

What a great show of unity by several neighbors who signed up for the tree service last month!

With the new landscaping for the common area and the new signs, the entire neighborhood is looking better—and our property values could use the boost, too!

It is always great to see that so many folks value where we live and show it by helping to keep the neighborhood vibrant.

When every resident moved to this neighborhood, each homeowner legally agreed to the covenants and deed restrictions of the homeowners association.

Everyone is equally entitled to the benefits of these covenants and restrictions. Unfortunately, everyone equally suffers when a homeowner violates them.

There has been a rise in deed restriction violations over the past few months. Neighbors are complaining and the Board will be addressing those violations immediately. The most common violations are trash and trailers.

President

Please be aware that you are not allowed to park trailers, with or without their cargo, for more than twenty-four hours on your property. Trailers may be parked on the property for longer periods only if the trailer or its cargo can NOT be seen from the street. For those property owners with lake views, trailers or their cargo may

not be parked on the property for

more than twenty-four hours if

they can be seen from the com-

mon grounds of the Association.

Please be aware that trash and debris must not be placed at the curb until 6PM the night before pickup. Excess trash and debris from construction or other activities may not stand on your property for more than twenty-four hours unless it is hidden from view of the street. For lake-side property owners, debris may not be held on those properties, for more than twenty-four hours, that can be seen from the common grounds of the Association. (Exceptions to this rule are made by the Association for approved

property improvements.)

The 2008 annual fees are now due. The annual dues are \$200.

Please make out your check for \$200 payable to the Hampton Lakes Homeowners Association. We cannot be responsible for cash payments and do not have a receipt system, so please do NOT pay by cash — your cancelled check will be your receipt.

Please deliver your check to 15817 Hampton Village Drive. You have until June 30, 2008, before you are considered late.
