Operation Kids Update

At the May meeting, Debbie and Tom Hennessy gave a brief presentation on the heart-felt gratitude of the Iraqi people. In a letter, Tom's son wrote "The children of Iraq are its future. The way they play, the way they smile and the way they act toward us when we give them your sweet simple presents is as helpful to them as it is to us." Tom explained that as a result of this gift-giving by our soldiers, parents started coming out of their homes to give our troops information on where the insurgents were hiding.

New California Cell Phone Laws Effective July 1, 2008

When driving in California, motorists had better think twice before using their cellular phones — unless it's for emergency purposes or a driver over the age of 18 is using a hands-free device. Starting July 1, 2008, California law will prohibit all drivers from talking while holding a wireless telephone. Drivers under 18 may not use a cell phone while driving even with a hands free-device. The law applies to everyone even if they are from another state where the practice is allowed.

The new laws, which apply only to the person driving the vehicle, carry fines of \$20 for a first offense and \$50 for subsequent infractions. With the addition of penalty assessments, the cost for ignoring this new law goes up. Based on the Uniform Bail and Penalty Schedule, a first offense would increase to \$76 and a second offense to \$190. Convictions will appear on the violator's driving record but will not result in a point on the driver's license.

Exceptions will be granted to:

- Motorists making 911 calls
- Emergency response personnel
- Until July 1, 2011, commercial vehicle drivers using a wireless push-to-talk phone
- Motorists operating a vehicle on private property



Using a hand-held wireless telephone while driving is considered a "primary" violation, meaning law enforcement officers can stop drivers solely for this


Congratulations! Join the Celebration!

WANA Habitat Restoration and Water Conservation Education Program

Bring the PV Blue Butterfly to Wrigley Campaign!

In 1983, the Palos Verdes Blue Butterfly (Glaucopsyche lygdamus paloverdesensis) was thought to have been driven to extinction due to development of its habitat (Mattoni 1995). However, in 1994, the butterfly was re-discovered on



the northern side of the Palos Verdes Peninsula. This new population lays eggs on a different food plant (common deerweed, Lotus scoparius), but shares physical and behavioral characteristics with the other now-extinct populations.

The Youth Environmental Leaders (YEL) Team is a Long Beach Organic Program. The WANA Chapter will work with volunteers Ken Gore, Nancy Risch and Edie Pearl to extend the Wrigley Landscape Project north of 19th Street with re-introduction of the Palos Verdes Blue in mind.

WANA has raised almost \$500 to purchase plants and supplies for restoration of this site in southwest Wrigley. For more information, contact Joan Greenwood by phone at (562) 599-0812 or by e-mail at

Dominguez Gap Restoration: Another Step in Creating a Los Angeles River Greenway from the Mountains to the Sea

Could a similar project be our vision for Wrigley Heights?

"One of our most challenging restoration efforts ever, the Dominguez Gap Wetlands will return important ecological functions of water quality improvement, wildlife habitat, and aquifer recharge to the urban lower Los Angeles River ," says CH2M HILL Principal Scientist Jim Bays. "By encompassing the restoration within an attractive community park, the project will be certain to become an exciting destination for birdwatchers, hikers, bicyclists and the interested public."

Construction is complete on the County's new 50-acre storm water and urbanrunoff containment facility and spreading grounds in Dominguez Gap. Bioengineered to treat polluted runoff with riparian habitat before it reaches Long Beach shores and beaches, the Wetlands is considered one of the top-five demonstration projects of the Los Angeles River Master Plan. Entrance gate is located on Del Amo Boulevard at Oregon Avenue east of the I-710 in North Long Beach. The Dominguez Gap Wetlands is a project of the Los Angeles County Flood Control District.
