The problem is, I find dogs without collars, or with collars---but no tags! Neighbors, it is the law that ALL dogs and cats in Dallas MUST be registered and vaccinated. There is absolutely no excuse to have a pet without identification on it. It is cruel to the dog, as without ID, many people will assume your furry member of the family is a stray, destined for the Animal Control officer and a pretty certain date with a needle.

It is also against city ordinance to have a dog off of a leash. Now, if you are in the front yard with your pet, and you can guarantee they will not run away or attack, then that is your decision. But too often, pet owners around here just let their dogs out to go "do their business," and then come back. That is dangerous and not very neighborly. PLEASE, keep control of your pets.

Make sure your yard is secure, doors closed. Dogs want to be free, and it is up to you to keep them on your property.

Should you lose your pet, please put up signs quickly. This helps keep your neighbors on the lookout for your beloved animal. If you see a sign for a "found" animal, please ask your neighbors if they saw the sign, and if they know of such an animal.

I found two lovely dogs on New Year's Day. I posted orange signs, and soon, they were reclaimed. It would have been so much easier of the owners had invested a mere \$10 per dog for a collar and tag!

Dogs are man's best friends, so we should be theirs as well.

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Economic Development Update

The Buckner Terrace Homer Owners Association (BTHA) has appointed its Economic Development Committee from District 4 and 7 to initiate a comprehensive review of existing economic development conditions in our neighbors. This broad based public input strategic analysis of issues and community desires, zoning change recommendation addressing land use, urban design, economic development incentives recommendations and neighborhood stabilization recommendations.

BTHA Economic Development Committee will address three (3) sections.

Section I Provides information on the *Community Needs Assessment* (CNA), which articulates those issues of concern within the community, and establishes the implementation priority for each as immediate, short-term and long-term.

Section II Is the heart of the plan. This section present three (3) functional elements that describe existing and future projects and specific policy and project recommendation to stimulate growth and development in the study area. Also, included in this section of the Plan are recommendation that complement the goals and objectives outlined in Forward Dallas Plan for the Buckner Terrance Area Plan.

Section III Presents the Implementation Schedule and identifies the implementing body (i.e., City Council, Buckner Terrance Homeowners Association, public, private and /or non-profit joint venture(s) to effectuate action toward the achievement of recommendations identified in the BTHA Plan.

What is coming up at the meeting?

Mr. Harold Wright will be our guest speaker. Mr. Wright is principal of Skyline High School. The news media has recently reported that DISD administration is planning to move some of the Magnets (or clusters) at Skyline. The magnets or cluster are career/college programs that attract many top students. These top students certainly have an impact on the TAKS test results, which affects the ranking of Skyline, which in turn affects people with children wanting to move into our neighborhood. Mr. Wright is not the decision-maker in this process and this is his first year at Skyline. He will have more information for us at the meeting.
