SUGGESTED GOOD NEIGHBOR GUIDELINES

Treat others the way you would like to be treated. The Golden Rule is the number one sign of a good neighbor.

Know your neighbor's names and phone numbers. This builds friendships and our neighborhood watch pro ram.

- **_____ Join BAHA**—*your neighborhood association.* A strong association helps attract and keep good neighbors. Our low annual dues are a small price to pay for improvements ded to ensure property values continue to go up.
- **Drive at or below the speed limit and come to a complete stop at stop signs.** The safety of our children and neighbors is far more important than getting to work on time.
- **Keep your home, yard, and vehicles looking good.** This shows respect for your neighbors, increases home values, and beautifies the community. Please keep your grass cut, edge your yard, pick-up trash and remove any grass growing in the street cracks. Please keep your vehicles locked and p d in your driveway—not on the street.
- **Think twice before you install burglar bars on your do** and windows. They decrease the value and resale potential of your home and your neighbor's. We have one of the lowest crime rates in Montgomery. To help keep that rate low, we recommend you install an electronic alarm system.
- _ Never park in your yard. Parking in your yard kills the grass and decreased the appearance and value of your home, as well as the value of your neighbor's home. In addition, if you leave your car parked in your yard for longer than 6 hours, it's a <u>violation</u> of city ordinances.

_ Don't park boats or trailers on the street. It creates traffic problems and is a violation of city ordinances.

- **Help keep streets free of trash.** Garbage pick-up is on Tuesdays and Fridays. Other trash is picked on Wednesdays. Please don't put your trash on the street until Tuesday afternoon. Trash left on the street for several days sets a bad example and creates a bad image for the neighborhood.
- _ Tell your neighbors when you are going to have a social at your home. This shows respect, avoids misunderstandings and potential police involvement. Please make sure noise cannot be heard outside your home.

__ Parents—please don't let your kids walk the streets after dark.

__ Parents—please teach your children the "Suggested Good Neighbor Guidelines for Children" listed below.

SUGGESTED GOOD NEIGHBOR GUIDELINES FOR CHILDREN

- ____ Always treat neighbors, adults, and children with resp ct.
- __ Music should be heard in the car, not outside the car.
- __ Get out of the road when a car is coming. Sidewalks are a safer place to walk.
- __ Please put litter in a garbage can, not on the street.
- __ Please keep school bus stop areas clean. Don't put trash in storm drains.
- __ Don't invite someone with poor character to visit you. They will bring their poor character & bad habits with them.
- **___ Bad language is never acceptable**—*it's a sign of poor character and upbringing.*
- ___ Teen/Young adults should not stand on street corners.
- __ Avoid walking down the street in large groups. It scares neighbors and potential homeowners.
- _ Never enter a neighbor's yard or property unless invited. Their basketball goal may look inviting, but you need an invitation to use it.
