

The Hampton Lakes neighborhood has had several facelifts and we are enjoying the benefits of our "new look".

Now it's time to draw attention to our homes and help make this the best looking neighborhood in Tampa.

Home values are stabilizing and we must do our best to ensure that *our* home values stay at the highest level possible.

We must understand that each home contributes to the overall look of the neighborhood; just one home in sub-par condition can devalue the entire neighborhood.

If you think your home is in fine condition, consider these facts:

Asphalt roofs have a typical life of fifteen to twenty (15-20) years. Our original roofs were shingled more than twenty years ago.

Wood siding and window frames should be painted every eight to ten (8-10) years.

Power washing of decks, drives, and walk-ways should be done at least once a year.

Irrigation systems should be evaluated once a year to ensure proper function.

Utilizing regular pest control is always a wise preventative measure here in Florida.

Shrubs and other accents should be evaluated for health and proper growth yearly.

Trimming of trees and shrubs is an aesthetic as well as functional necessity.

So, take a moment and walk around the neighborhood; when you return, take a serious look at your home.

Ask yourself if it really looks as good as some of your neighbors.

In my last letter I appealed to all homeowners that they, "...make an effort to meet the competi-

It is my great pleasure to announce that the Board has successfully collected past due association fees from 77 out of the 79 homeowners; that includes past due fees from previous years, too!

We are excited to know that our new collection system yielded those results so quickly and that our financial status is very healthy.

Hillsborough County Cleanup Day dubbed, "Trash Bash".

Volunteers from the HLHA donated their time (and trucks!) to drive around the neighborhood and collect trash; trash that would not be picked up by the weekly County collection.

It took several hours and many trips to the designated drop point, but the work was completed with great success.

The HLHA also conducted a Hampton Lake cleanup on the same morning; trash was collected along the shoreline and the lake never looked better!

#### The Reserve at Hampton Lakes

#### **Truck Passage**

The Hampton Lakes Reserve has made a lot of progress recently. Large payload trucks have been traveling through the neighborhood every day and they will continue to do so for several weeks to come. The Board recently asked that all trucks use Hoedt Road and Hampton Village Drive for ingress and egress. "No Trucks" signs were posted at each end of Glenarn Street. We have a well established and open communication channel with the construction foreman and related contractors, so if you see any construction trucks (associated with the HLR project) using Glenarn for passage, please notify the Board immediately.

#### **Natural Gas Line**

The builder would like to provide a natural gas line to their project. The builder asked us to poll everyone to see if we might be interested in the benefits of natural gas, too. Since the gas line will be added to the construction site, it would be beneficial to any other parties, along the same route, to take advantage of the process at the time of construction. The line will be added to the area, but retrofitting our homes would be a separate and independent project that would vary according to each home's specific conditions. THIS IS NOT A MANDATORY OFFER. This is only an inquiry to determine if there might be other interested parties. Therefore, please let us know if you are interested in natural gas as an alternative to your heating and cooking needs. Please notify the Board via email by October 1, 2008.
