Message from the President



As we head into our first board elections on October 2, I have had the great distinction and honor of serving as your very FIRST President of WANA this past year. I have to admit that some of my time has been grueling and tiresome while occasionally asking why I was putting myself through this but I persevered BECAUSE we were on a mission – to start up a

brand spanking new 501c3 and 501c4 corporation. And why did we need to accomplish this mission?

Please indulge me while I digress. The main reason for the new start up was the Wrigley Association's action taken to disengage itself from the now 55 year old tradition named Christmas Tree Lane (CTL) and the lack of and silencing of member discussion on the matter. Without warning or notice at a Wrigley Association board meeting in March of 2007, with a blink of the eye, the motion was made to separate with a vote of 6-Yes, 5-No. Wrigley residents, CTL was NOT going to happen last year if nothing was done about this.

Maria Norvell, Joan Greenwood, Nancy Risch, Timothy Risch, Jim Trout, Joan Pizzato and myself banded together as your founding board members of WANA, formerly know as the Wrigley Area Neighborhood Alliance, Inc., to continue the tradition that Wrigley has come to be known for. We accomplished something that I think people never thought we could. We formed a new non-profit organization and took over the stewardship of CTL. We, of course, had our struggles but we all rose to the occasion like a protective mother over her children, and took charge. Residents had faith in our intentions and starting joining the Alliance. And my friends I can tell you now that Wrigley is in good hands and I thank for your good judgment and trust by investing some of your money and time with us.

What makes WANA board members unique is that while most people say they don't have time to serve on a board, we 7 board members kept giving and giving to this organization even while going through our own hardships and personal difficulties in our lives. And I'd just like to remind you that NONE of us gets paid. All the board members have helped in one way or another at EVERY event and activity WANA has sponsored.

Environmental Report — The High Cost of Dependence on Foreign Oil

The South Coast Air Quality Management District invited Nancy Risch and me to be its guests at the California Air Pollution Control Officer's Association "Future is Green Conference" held at the Long Beach Convention Center in mid-September. At the conference, I was able to hear first hand about the Pickens Plan for energy independence. "To put it plainly, T. Boone Pickens is out to save America," said Carl Pope, executive director of the Sierra Club. For years, Pickens, pictured at left with me, has pressed presidents and industry representatives on the need for a coherent U.S. Energy policy. His vision involves using natural gas vehicles (NGV) for fleet operations and developing a mid-western corridor that would serve as the hub for providing solar- and wind-generated power

to the East and West Coasts. Pickens is outraged at how the United States is spending \$700 billion a year on foreign oil — considerably more than the solutions he is proposing and "the largest transfer of wealth in the history of mankind". In television and print advertisements, in stories and every imaginable talk-show format, appearances before Congress and town hall meetings across the country, he bluntly tells Americans that "A fool with a plan is better than a genius with no plan and that we look like fools without a plan." His most shocking statement was how far behind we are in importing NGVs for sale in the U.S.! General Motors manufactures 15 models, but doesn't offer a single one to U.S. consumers! Look for his ad blitz between now and the November elections and learn more by googling "PickensPlan". His approach will make U.S.-made goods competitive in world markets, again.

John doesn't reside in Wrigley, but he has been a Wrigley supporter for many years. He lives just north of Wardlow in the Los Cerritos neighborhood with his wife Janet. John is always willing to roll up his sleeves and help wherever he is needed. He is a big supporter of Christmas Tree Lane, and has worked on the Parade and Christmas Tree Lane.

When the disagreement and separation occurred last year, WANA was formed. John volunteered to pay dues for up to 100 members that joined on a trial basis. Thanks for your emails and letters, both the California State Assembly and the Senate have passed SB 974. The media has really grabbed on to the story of Gov. Sarah Palin asking Schwarzenegger to veto SB 974. **The take away message?** . Let's keep the heat on the Governor's office! The Ports Investment Bill (SB 974 Lowenthal) will create an ongoing funding stream to help clean up air pollution.


WANA has finished its first year with 129 dues-paying households and businesses representing over 240 individual members. Together, we can make a difference.

Community Crime Prevention Meetings are held the **third Wednesday of every month**. The next meeting is on October 15th at 7:00 p.m. Location is the **Long Beach Water Department**, 2950 Redondo Avenue. Please bring a neighbor. These public meetings are very informative.

It is much easier to do something to prevent a problem than to deal with it after it has happened. Most criminals are not professional, but are opportunistic. The most effective thing we can do is to educate the community so that they will not provide the opportunity for these criminals. We are trying to educate people on crime prevention methods through many means like community meetings with LBPD staff and at neighborhood watch meetings.

Identity theft is one of the nation's fastest-growing, most expensive crimes. Many people are unaware that their information and bank accounts have been targeted. Identity thieves use stolen information to obtain new credit cards; open checking accounts; make long distance phone calls; or make purchases on stolen credit cards. If you think it can't happen to you, Think again. Let me know if you would to schedule a speaker on this topic at a future WANA meeting.


