PARTNERSHIP GRANT UPDATE

MAPS has completed their project at Horace Mann Elementary! We are currently working with school officials to finalize plans for placement of the proposed playground equipment. This project should be done by the next newsletter. We are still waiting to hear from OG&E to get the cost of installing a few more lights to complete our final grant project. We hope to have all projects completed by the end of the year so that we can apply for another grant.

WESTERN AVENUE BID

According to the okcbusiness.com on 7/21/2008 Western Avenue is getting ready to receive \$3.2 million dollars from the city's 2007 General Obligation Bond Issue to make improvements along Western Avenue between NW 36th and NW 63rd streets. Granted as a Business Improvement District last August, Western Avenue's BID priorities include dressing up the I-44 bridge, replacing as many of the concrete medians as possible with green space, replacing street signs and traffic signals with more historic looking signs and incorporating public art. The president of Western Avenue Association, Mel Martin, also said that there will be additional sidewalks. Work is expected to begin in 12-18 months.



ADOPT-A-DOG IN OCTOBER

October is Adopt-a-dog month at the OKC Animal Shelter. This event promotes the adoption of dogs into new forever homes. The rate to obtain your next best friend is \$25 and covers spaying or neutering, a heartworm test, flea and tick treatment and vaccinations against rabies and contagious diseases. PREPARING YOUR HOME FOR FALL

Winter is fastly approaching. Now is the time to prepare our home and outdoor items for it. The following is a list of tips to prepare our property from the potentially long, cold and icy months ahead of us.

- *Have your heating system checked to make sure that it is functioning properly before cold temperatures arrive.
- *If you have a fireplace, hire a chimney sweep to clean built up creosote, debris and nesting creatures so that you can enjoy a fire on the cool nights.
- *Inspect your roof to make sure that there are no missing, loose or damaged shingles or tiles.
- *After the leaves have fallen clean out your gutters and downspouts and make sure that they are in good condition.
- *Clean up any debris from around your heat pump or air conditioning unit.
- *Remove window air conditioners if possible.
- *Pressure wash siding to remove any dirt, debris and tree sap to extend the life of it.
- *Trim trees to make sure that there are no branches hanging over the roof. (We know about this from last winter!)
- *Winterize your lawn by raking up leaves, giving grass a good cut and removing any cool-weather weeds, then fertilize the lawn to keep it green and protect it from pests and cold. For more information on this check with your local extension service.
- *Prepare your garden and planting beds by mulching around your bulbs, roses, trees and shrubs to prevent damage to the root systems by the sudden changes in soil temperatures.
- *Run the gas out of the mower or add a stabilizer agent for storage. Also change the oil, pull and inspect the spark plug and the engine oil. Clean your gardening tools and apply a light coat of oil to protect them from rust.
- *Drain the water from your garden hose, coil it up and hang it where it won't freeze and crack. If you have a sprinkler system drain it too and shut off the water to prevent the pipes from freezing.
- *Inspect the condition of your deck or patio. Clean the deck with soapy water and a pole brush. Use deck wash to remove stains. To clean a concrete patio use TSP or a concrete cleaner then scrub with a brush and rinse well. Be sure to protect shrubs before cleaning with chemicals.
- *Clean and/or repair your outdoor furniture. It's a good idea to store or cover these during the winter.
- *Fire up your grill to remove any cooked-on food then clean the grill and racks with a wire brush. If possible store for the winter.

CITY OF OKLAHOMA CITY WALKING TRAILS

The Oklahoma City Trails are a network of paved walking, running, bicycling and skating paths that will eventually stretch all across Oklahoma City and many of its suburbs. They are great for a brisk exercise walk to a leisurely evening stroll. Some are also biking and hiking trails.

In-Park Trails and Walking Paths

- *Bluff Creek Park, Hefner Road at Meridian 3.5 miles off-road running and biking trail (natural)
- *Bluff Creek Park, Hefner Road at Meridian 1 mile / asphalt sidewalk (opens Fall 08)
- *Brock Park, 1601 SW 25 0.5 miles of asphalt and concrete sidewalk
- *Dolese Park, NW 50 & Meridian 2.1 miles of natural trail
- *Martin Park Nature Center, 5000 West Memorial Road 3 miles of off road gravel, dirt trails for hiking, jogging, walking
- *Merrel Medley Park, Kingsridge & Pennsylvania -. 0.8 miles of limestone screening
- *Memorial Park, NW 36 & Classen 0.6 miles of gravel trail; 0.5 miles of concrete
- *South Lakes Park, SW 119 and Meridian 1.2 miles of asphalt

- *Quail Creek Park, 11102 Quail Creek Road 0.4 miles
- *Ross Park, 2700 NW 62 0.3 miles
- *Schilling Park, SE 25 & Durland 0.4 miles
- *Sellers Park, 8301 South Villa 0.4 miles
- *Shallow Brook Park, 4901 S Shallow Brook Drive - 0.5 miles
- *Smitty Park, 2400 NW 44 0.25 miles
- *Taylor Park, 1113 SW 70th 0.3 miles
- *Top O Town Park, SE 19 & Stonewall 0.3 miles

Also available are the Oklahoma Trails which contain 13 miles of multiuse asphalt trails located on the north and south banks of the river.

Bluff Creek and Lake Stanley Draper also have Mountain biking and hiking trails.
