Architectural Committee

NEWS FROM THE ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

Your Arbor Croft Architectural Committee continues to work on issues that affect our community.

The committee has reviewed several requests for changes in the neighborhood. The requests have mostly been for landscaping or small projects such as a deck.

Our main project during these early stages of HOA development has been developing a set of architectural guidelines. The guidelines will provide information to owners planning modifications and also serve as a reference for current and future members of the ARC. These guidelines are not meant to be all inclusive. Other issues will come along. Nor are the guidelines meant to be "The Law". They are, as they are named, guidelines.

Two of the first completed guidelines were attached to the September newsletter. One was about fences, the other on storm doors. When feasible, the ARC wants you to be able to proceed with a project without getting ARC approval prior to starting it. Obviously, that makes life easier for everyone. So, you may have noticed that the info regarding storm doors was titled "Preapproved". That simply means any homeowner may go to Lowe's any Saturday, buy a storm door which complies to the "Preapproved" guidelines, and install the door, without going though the request process. Now here comes the big question. Does that mean you cannot have a different style door? NO! It does not. But, if you want a different door, you need to go through the request and approval process. We will try to make other modifications "preapproved" as we continue to develop the guidelines. (Note that the fence info was titled "Guidelines", therefore prior approval is required.)

As we have all noticed, some of us have decorated for Halloween. Soon Thanksgiving, then Christmas will come rushing in, along with holiday displays of delight. Regarding holiday

décor, the guidelines are simple. No approval is required. Displays may go up 30 days prior to the holiday and are to be removed by 15 days after the holiday. The ARC reserves the right to request removal of any item(s) if there are complaints or if deemed offensive.

As the committee works through the development of guidelines, they will be available to you through the newsletter as well as the website. Work is getting underway on a neighborhood handbook also. The handbook will contain the guidelines plus loads of other information.

Development Updates

As you might have noticed the streetlights in Phase I have been replaced and new Phase II streetlights have been installed. The total number of streetlights is now ten and hopefully that will be enough for the neighborhood. We do have an option of placing more streetlights in the future for a cost of \$360.00 per light fixture and an ongoing expense of \$8.80 per light per month.
