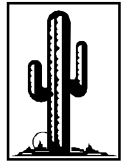

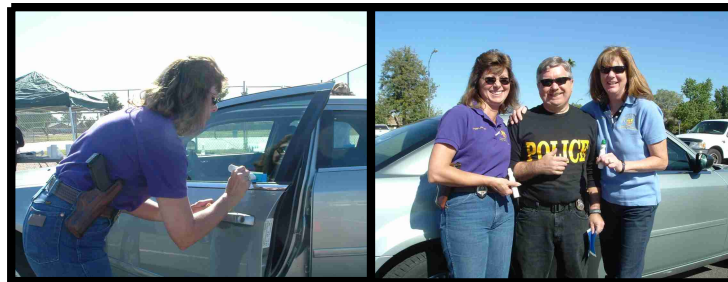

- ⇒ Memorize your license plate number and have it immediately assessable.
- ⇒ Enroll in the Watch Your Car Program by calling **1-888-668-4433**.
- ⇒ The best prevention is to make your vehicle more difficult to steal
