New Common Area Fence ...and repairs.

During the first week of December, we removed the old fence posts that outlined our common area and replaced them with a new split-rail fence.

The fence was capped at both ends with a single corner section and two single section corners were added to the entrance walk that leads to the dock.

Reflectors were added to the end posts in order to alert night drivers and official "No Parking" signs will be added to each end as soon as they

arrive from the vendor.

In addition, we cleaned up and had major repairs done to the dock in order to make it safe and secure.

Lastly, we replaced the dock light which continued to have problems — the new light works extremely well.

All of this was done without having to raise our dues or ask for additional funds!
