Using Your Hand as a Ruler

*Did you know the span of your arms is almost identical to your height?

*Hence, the distance from your nose to your fingertip is half your height. For example: That's a yard if you are six feet tall. If you are not six feet tall you can still approximate a yard by turning your head toward your hand if you are taller and away from your hand if you are shorter. Calibrate this distance with a yardstick. Then you can easily measure off yards of rope, fabric, jungle vine or any other flexible material.

*The span of your stretched out hand from tip of your small finger to tip of your thumb is another measurement, seven to ten inches depending on the size of your hand. Measure it. Then you can just move your hand across an object inchworm fashion and multiply the number of hand spans by the width of your span.

*For smaller measurement, your bent down index finger works well. From fingertip to your first joint is close to an inch, and from the first to second joint is about an inch and a half.

*And of course, when measuring horses, it is the width of your palm (four inches) repeated from the horses hoof to shoulder. A Shetland pony stands about 10 hands high and a Clydesdale up to 17 hands high.

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



El Dorado Exemplary Homes Campaign 2009 By Eric Meyer

In 2007, the El Dorado Homes Association held the first ever Exemplary Homes Campaign as a way to recognize and thank those residents, both owners and renters, who help make El Dorado a nice place to live through payment of their annual association maintenance fees and by keeping a well maintained home and property.

The guidelines for participation in the event are pretty simple: just pay your annual association maintenance fees and keep up your property's curb appeal by having nice landscaping and high maintenance standards.

The campaign is divided into two phases, where 30 exemplary homes are chosen in May and 30 more are chosen in August. Since many residents don't pay their annual maintenance fees until summer, when the pool opens, May's winners are limited to those residents who paid their maintenance fees in 2008 and August's winners are limited to those who pay their fees for 2009.

To determine which homes are awarded Exemplary Home status, the six neighborhood association area reps will nominate 8 to 10 homes in each of their respective areas. Then an independent panel of judges, who do not live in El Dorado and who do not know last year's winners, will score the nominees. The scores will then be averaged and the 5 homes with the highest scores in each area will be given the title of Exemplary Home.

The winners receive a temporary yard sign announcing their status as an Exemplary Home and also an invitation to the Exemplary Homes Party on September 19, from 6 to 8pm at the neighborhood clubhouse and pool. At the party, food and beverages will be served and all winners will have a shot at winning fabulous door prizes generously donated by the event's sponsors.

Judging will take place the first week in May and again the first week in August. All residents are encouraged to clean up and increase the curb appeal of their property. Judges will be looking at the overall appearance of the homes and property. In many cases, it's the minor details which determine the winners. Homes with deed, covenant, or code violations are automatically ineligible from participating.





I'm writing because of an incident that happened to my daughter involving a neighbor. I think this incident should also concern other El Dorado residents, especially those that live in Area II.

Thursday morning, 3/19/09, at about 8:30, my daughter was called by a male neighbor to get her attention as she was walking from the driveway into our house. My daughter ignored him and continued to go inside. Several minutes later, this same individual went to our house and knocked on the door. My daughter didn't open the door, but did look to see who was there through the window and noticed that it was the neighbor from a few minutes earlier. He then noticed her through the window and asked her if her internet was working, because his wasn't. She responded that it was fine. He then proceeded to ask her if she was alone. When she said that her brother was coming and that he was five minutes away, he turned away and left.

I'm thankful that nothing more happened, but now my wife and my daughter feel unsafe and uncomfortable in our own home and in our own neighborhood. I've contacted the police, but they've practically said that no actual crime had been committed, so there was nothing they could do. I can understand that.

We have since been concerned about this and feel that it should be brought to the attention of other residents in our neighborhood. We have lived in El Dorado for 10 years and have always felt safe and secure, but now are we going to have to worry about some kind of predator living in our midst?



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
