#### On Dock Rail Project in Port of Long Beach Opportunities and Challenges

The use of on-dock rail has long been hailed as an environmental victory because it minimizes the need for trucks to take cargo from the docks through West Long Beach neighborhoods to transfer facilities. Feedback from the community has already begun. On September 16, seventeen public speakers (including WANA's President and me) expressed support and concerns during a community forum at Port Headquarters. The most common themes for negative impacts identified by the speakers are: affects on Westside businesses due to street closures and taking of property by eminent domain; possible removal of historic structures; health and noise impacts on nearby childcare facility and multi-service center administering to the homeless in the proposed buffer zone north of the new facility. The real challenge is how the Port will handle the challenge of reconciling environmental, economic and social impacts and identifying mitigation strategies that address public concerns. This is what Sustainability is all about. It's not just the environment. While economic and social impacts are not necessarily studied during the EIR preparation process, the Port has adopted a policy of Sustainability and can run these additional study processes in parallel.


