

Long Beach Association, Zeta Phi Beta sorority members, a number of high schoolers, local residents, and WANA members worked in teams pick-


ing up the trash. A resident in a motorized scooter even joined in. She used a hand-held "grabber" to pick up trash along Pacific Avenue!






