




#### **Snake Saturday to Celebrate 25 Years**



Following are articles **submitted by the two candidates** running for the position of Special Road District No. 3 Commissioner. Although the Bolling Heights Community Link does not endorse any one candidate, we do believe it is important for our residents to be informed. Make your voice heard by voting on April 7th!

#### John Garner—For Roads Done Right

John Garner cares about Gladstone streets. That's why he's running for commissioner of the Gladstone Special Road District #3.

John wants streets to be well-maintained and safe for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians. This means curbs, street lights for better visibility, sidewalks on at least one side and no dangerous roadside ditches.

To reduce wear and tear on vehicles, John also wants to bring all manhole covers level with the surface of the street.

John has the experience to get the job done right.

As President of Stormy Acres Neighborhood Association, John was instrumental in road repairs on NW 61st and 64th Streets and other beautification and infrastructure improvements in the neighborhood.

When he lived in Platte County, John was responsible for getting an ordinance passed requiring builders to clean up debris from roads promptly.

"If elected, I want the first impression of Road District streets to be one of a job done right," he said.

Special Road District #3 includes most of the streets within the City of Gladstone.

Commissioners are elected for three-year terms.
